2 Public Safety – Protecting Against Hate Crimes Grant Fund – Establishment

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Protecting Against Hate Crimes Grant Fund as a 4 special, nonlapsing fund to make grants to nonprofit organizations, including $\mathbf{5}$ faith-based organizations, to provide security enhancements to protect against hate 6 crimes; requiring the Executive Director of the Governor's Office of Crime 7 Prevention, Youth, and Victim Services to administer the Fund; requiring 8 authorizing, for fiscal year 2025 and each fiscal year thereafter, the Governor to 9 include in the annual budget bill a certain appropriation to the Fund; and generally 10 relating to the Protecting Against Hate Crimes Grant Fund.

4 (E) (1) THE FUND IS A SPECIAL, NONLAPSING FUND THAT IS NOT 5 SUBJECT TO § 7–302 OF THE STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT ARTICLE.

6 (2) THE STATE TREASURER SHALL HOLD THE FUND SEPARATELY, 7 AND THE COMPTROLLER SHALL ACCOUNT FOR THE FUND.

- 8 (F) THE FUND CONSISTS OF:
- 9 (1) MONEY APPROPRIATED IN THE STATE BUDGET TO THE FUND;
- 10 (2) ANY INTEREST EARNINGS OF THE FUND; AND

11 (3) ANY OTHER MONEY FROM ANY OTHER SOURCE ACCEPTED FOR 12 THE BENEFIT OF THE FUND.

13 (G) THE FUND MAY BE USED ONLY TO MAKE GRANTS TO NONPROFIT 14 ORGANIZATIONS, INCLUDING FAITH-BASED ORGANIZATIONS, TO PROVIDE 15 SECURITY ENHANCEMENTS TO PROTECT AGAINST HATE CRIMES.

16 (H) (1) THE STATE TREASURER SHALL INVEST THE MONEY OF THE FUND 17 IN THE SAME MANNER AS OTHER STATE MONEY MAY BE INVESTED.

18 (2) ANY INTEREST EARNINGS OF THE FUND, INCLUDING INTEREST 19 EARNINGS UNDER SUBSECTION (F) OF THIS SECTION, SHALL BE CREDITED TO THE 20 FUND.

21 (I) EXPENDITURES FROM THE FUND MAY BE MADE ONLY IN ACCORDANCE 22 WITH THE STATE BUDGET.

(J) MONEY EXPENDED FROM THE FUND FOR GRANTS TO NONPROFIT
 ORGANIZATIONS, INCLUDING FAITH-BASED ORGANIZATIONS, TO PROVIDE
 SECURITY ENHANCEMENTS TO PROTECT AGAINST HATE CRIMES IS SUPPLEMENTAL
 TO AND IS NOT INTENDED TO TAKE THE PLACE OF FUNDING THAT OTHERWISE
 WOULD BE APPROPRIATED FOR PROVIDING NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS,
 INCLUDING FAITH-BASED ORGANIZATIONS, WITH SECURITY ENHANCEMENTS TO
 PROTECT AGAINST HATE CRIMES.

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FOR FISCAL YEAR 2025 AND EACH FISCAL YEAR THEREAFTER, THE 1 **(K)** $\mathbf{2}$ GOVERNOR SHALL MAY INCLUDE IN THE ANNUAL BUDGET BILL AN APPROPRIATION 3 OF \$5,000,000 TO THE FUND. 4 **Article – State Finance and Procurement** 6-226. $\mathbf{5}$ Notwithstanding any other provision of law, and unless 6 (a) (2)(i) 7 inconsistent with a federal law, grant agreement, or other federal requirement or with the 8 terms of a gift or settlement agreement, net interest on all State money allocated by the 9 State Treasurer under this section to special funds or accounts, and otherwise entitled to receive interest earnings, as accounted for by the Comptroller, shall accrue to the General 10 Fund of the State. 11 12(ii) The provisions of subparagraph (i) of this paragraph do not apply 13 to the following funds: 14170. the Cannabis Public Health Fund; [and] 15171. the Community Reinvestment and Repair Fund; AND 16 **172.** THE PROTECTING AGAINST HATE CRIMES GRANT 17FUND. SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED. That this Act shall take effect July 18 19 1, 2023.
