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## CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Gaming – Study on Video Lottery Terminals at Baltimore–Washington**  
3 **International Thurgood Marshall Airport**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Aviation Administration, in consultation with  
5 the State Lottery and Gaming Control Commission, to conduct a study on the  
6 feasibility of granting a video lottery operation license for a video lottery facility in  
7 Baltimore–Washington International Thurgood Marshall Airport; and generally  
8 relating to the operation of video lottery terminals in the State.

9 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
10 That:

11 (a) The Maryland Aviation Administration, in consultation with the State Lottery  
12 and Gaming Control Commission, shall conduct a study on the feasibility of authorizing a  
13 video lottery operation license for a video lottery facility within Baltimore–Washington  
14 International Thurgood Marshall Airport.

15 (b) The study shall examine the feasibility of, and any issues relating to, the  
16 operation of video lottery terminals at Baltimore–Washington International Thurgood  
17 Marshall Airport that the ~~Commission~~ Administration deems relevant, including:

18 (1) an analysis of the number of video lottery terminals that could be  
19 reasonably placed within the airport terminal building;

1 (2) a determination of possible locations for video lottery terminals within  
2 the grounds of the airport terminal building; and

3 (3) a discussion of potential effects on State revenue and expenditures.

4 (c) On or before October 1, 2024, the ~~Commission~~ Administration shall report its  
5 findings and recommendations to the General Assembly, in accordance with § 2-1257 of  
6 the State Government Article.

7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July  
8 1, 2024.
