

21	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,			
22	That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 1 (f) The Fund may be used only to provide grants to eligible counties to establish 2 or improve pretrial services programs.
- 3 (g) (1) The State Treasurer shall invest the money of the Fund in the same 4 manner as other State money may be invested.
- 5 (2) Any interest earnings of the Fund shall be credited to the Fund.
- 6 (h) Expenditures from the Fund may be made only in accordance with the State 7 budget.
- 8 (i) The accounts and transactions of the Fund shall be subject to audit by the 9 Legislative Auditor as provided in § 2–1220 of the State Government Article.
- 10 4–1103.
- 11 (a) The Executive Director shall:
- 12 (1) establish procedures for eligible counties to apply for and receive grants 13 from the Fund; and
- 14 (2) solicit grant proposals from eligible counties.
- 15 (b) An eligible county that applies for a grant from the Fund shall provide the 16 Executive Director with:
- 17 (1) a description of how the proposed pretrial services program or proposed 18 pretrial services program improvements will meet the requirements of § 4–1104 of this 19 subtitle; and
- 20 (2) any other information that the Executive Director considers necessary.
- 21 (c) The Executive Director shall make grants from the Fund to eligible counties 22 for the establishment or improvement of a pretrial services program in accordance with § 23 4–1104 of this subtitle.
- 24 (d) An eligible county that receives a grant from the Fund shall submit to the 25 Executive Director proof of the expenditure of the grant funds.
- 26 (e) Money distributed under this subtitle shall be used to supplement and not supplant any other funding for the establishment or improvement of a pretrial services program.

- 30 **(A)** A pretrial services program established or improved using a grant distributed 31 in accordance with § 4–1103 of this subtitle shall:

4		(i)	is eligible for release:	
5			1. on personal recognizance; or	
6			2. with appropriate pretrial supervision; or	
7		(ii)	should be held without bail;	
8	(2)	apply	best practices shown to be effective in other jurisdictions; and	
9 10	(3) incorporate multiple levels of supervision based on defendant risk scores with features that include:			
11		(i)	cellular telephone reminders of a defendant's hearing date;	
12		(ii)	drug and alcohol testing;	
13		(iii)	global positioning satellite monitoring, if applicable; and

It shall remain effective for a period of [5] 10 years and, at the end of June 30, [2023] 2028, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
