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## Election Law - Campaign Finance Violations - Injunctive Relief

- FOR the purpose of authorizing the chairman or vice chairman of the State Board of Elections to seek an injunction against a violation of the campaign finance laws; repealing the authority of the Secretary of State to seek an injunction against a violation of the campaign finance laws; authorizing a candidate to seek an injunction against certain violations of the campaign finance laws against certain persons; and generally relating to injunctive relief against violations of the campaign finance laws.

- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND.

- 19 (a) The [Secretary of State] CHAIRMAN OR THE VICE CHAIRMAN OF THE 20 STATE BOARD may seek an immediate injunction against any violation of this title.
- 21 (B) A CANDIDATE MAY SEEK AN IMMEDIATE INJUNCTION AGAINST ANY 22 VIOLATION OF THIS TITLE BY THE FOLLOWING PERSONS:



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- THE CAMPAIGN FINANCE ENTITY SUPPORTING THE CANDIDACY 1 **(1)** 2 OF ANY CANDIDATE FOR THE SAME OFFICE; 3 **(2)** ANY PERSON REQUIRED TO FILE AN INDEPENDENT EXPENDITURE 4 REPORT UNDER § 13-306 OF THIS TITLE IF A PUBLIC COMMUNICATION RELATES TO THE CANDIDATE; OR 5 6 **(3)** ANY PERSON REQUIRED TO FILE AN ELECTIONEERING 7 COMMUNICATION REPORT UNDER § 13–307 OF THIS TITLE IF AN ELECTIONEERING COMMUNICATION RELATES TO THE CANDIDATE. 8 9 [(b)] **(C)** A person who violates an injunction issued under this section: 10 (1) is in criminal contempt; and is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a fine not 11 (2) 12 exceeding \$250 or imprisonment not exceeding 30 days or both.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2015.
