A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Natural Resources – Reclassification of Oyster Sanctuaries – Authorization

- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Department of Natural Resources to reclassify an 4 oyster sanctuary in which the oyster population has declined by a certain amount over a certain number of years as an oyster growth sanctuary; establishing the $\mathbf{5}$ 6 purpose of an oyster growth sanctuary; requiring that any activity conducted in an 7 oyster growth sanctuary comply with certain adaptive management practices; 8 requiring that an oyster growth sanctuary be considered an oyster sanctuary for 9 purposes of calculating a certain ovster habitat objective; making a conforming 10 change; providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to oyster 11 sanctuaries.

- 22 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 23 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
 - Article Natural Resources

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1 (e) (3)(i) Subject to subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph AND EXCEPT AS $\mathbf{2}$ **PROVIDED IN § 4–1014.5 OF THIS TITLE**, the Department may not take any action to reduce or alter the boundaries of the oyster sanctuaries established in "Oyster Sanctuaries 3 of the Chesapeake Bay and its Tidal Tributaries (September 2010)" until the Department 4 has developed a fisheries management plan for the scientific management of the oyster $\mathbf{5}$ 6 stock following the completion of its reports in accordance with paragraph (3) of this 7 subsection.

- 8 (ii) This paragraph may not be construed to prevent the Department
- 9 from:

10 1. Selecting the final two tributaries for tributary-scale 11 oyster restoration sanctuary projects in accordance with the 2014 Chesapeake Bay 12 Agreement; or

13 2. Establishing, in the discretion of the Department, any
14 dimensions for a tributary-scale oyster restoration sanctuary project.

16 (A) THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO THE NETWORK OF OYSTER 17 SANCTUARIES ESTABLISHED UNDER § 4–1014 OF THIS SUBTITLE.

18 **(B) (1)** THE DEPARTMENT MAY RECLASSIFY AN OYSTER SANCTUARY IN 19 WHICH THE OYSTER POPULATION HAS DECLINED BY 15% OR MORE OVER A 10–YEAR 20 PERIOD AS AN OYSTER GROWTH SANCTUARY.

21 (2) THE PURPOSE OF THE OYSTER GROWTH SANCTUARY IS TO 22 FOSTER THE PLACEMENT OF OYSTER SEED AND ENCOURAGE THE REPRODUCTION 23 AND GROWTH OF OYSTERS.

(3) ANY ACTIVITY CONDUCTED IN AN OYSTER GROWTH SANCTUARY
MUST COMPLY WITH ADAPTIVE MANAGEMENT PRACTICES IMPLEMENTED IN
ACCORDANCE WITH THE 2019 MARYLAND CHESAPEAKE BAY OYSTER
MANAGEMENT PLAN.

(C) AN OYSTER GROWTH SANCTUARY SHALL BE CONSIDERED AN OYSTER
SANCTUARY FOR PURPOSES OF CALCULATING THE 2019 MARYLAND CHESAPEAKE
BAY OYSTER MANAGEMENT PLAN OBJECTIVE THAT A MINIMUM OF BETWEEN 20%
AND 30% OF OYSTER HABITAT BE PRESERVED IN SANCTUARIES.
