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Higher Education – Maryland Technology Internship Program

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Technology Internship Program; 4 establishing certain purposes of the Program; requiring the Shriver Center located at the University of Maryland, Baltimore County (UMBC) to administer $\mathbf{5}$ 6 the Program and, in collaboration with the Department of Business and 7 Economic Development, undertake certain activities to carry out the purposes of 8 the Program; establishing certain eligibility requirements for participation in 9 the Program; requiring the Shriver Center UMBC to develop a process for tracking and assessing certain outcomes; requiring the Shriver Center UMBC to 10 11 obtain feedback from Program participants at certain times; authorizing the use 12 of certain awards to reimburse certain businesses for up to a certain percentage 13of the amount paid to an intern up to a certain amount; requiring the Shriver 14 Center UMBC to prepare a certain annual report; requiring the Governor to 15make an appropriation in the State budget for a certain purpose; defining 16 certain terms; and generally relating to the Maryland Technology Internship 17 Program.
