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## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Public Safety – Handgun Permits – Renewal Period for Retired Law**  
3 **Enforcement Officer**

4 FOR the purpose of establishing that a handgun permit issued to a retired law enforcement  
5 officer of the State or a county or municipal corporation of the State expires on the  
6 last day of the holder's birth month following a certain period after the date the  
7 permit is issued and may be renewed for successive periods of a certain length under  
8 certain circumstances; providing that a retired law enforcement officer who applies  
9 for the renewal of a permit is not required to be fingerprinted except under certain  
10 circumstances; and generally relating to handgun permits.

21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
22 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

23 **Article – Public Safety**

24 5–301.

1 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

2 (d) "Permit" means a permit issued by the Secretary to carry, wear, or transport  
3 a handgun.

4 5-304.

5 (b) (1) Subject to subsections (c) and (d) of this section, the Secretary may  
6 charge a nonrefundable fee payable when an application is filed for a permit.

7 (d) The Secretary may not charge a fee under subsection (b) of this section to:

8 (2) a retired law enforcement officer of the State or a county or municipal  
9 corporation of the State.

10 5-309.

11 (a) **[A] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, A permit**  
12 **expires on the last day of the holder's birth month following 2 years after the date the**  
13 **permit is issued.**

14 (b) **[A] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, A permit**  
15 **may be renewed for successive periods of 3 years each if, at the time of an application for**  
16 **renewal, the applicant possesses the qualifications for the issuance of a permit and pays**  
17 **the renewal fee stated in this subtitle.**

18 **(C) (1) A PERMIT ISSUED TO A RETIRED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OF**  
19 **THE STATE OR A COUNTY OR MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE STATE:**

20 **(I) EXPIRES ON THE LAST DAY OF THE HOLDER'S BIRTH MONTH**  
21 **FOLLOWING 5 YEARS AFTER THE DATE THE PERMIT IS ISSUED; AND**

22 **(II) MAY BE RENEWED FOR SUCCESSIVE PERIODS OF 5 YEARS**  
23 **EACH IF, AT THE TIME OF AN APPLICATION FOR RENEWAL, THE APPLICANT**  
24 **POSSESSES THE QUALIFICATIONS FOR THE ISSUANCE OF A PERMIT.**

25 **(2) A RETIRED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OF THE STATE OR A**  
26 **COUNTY OR MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE STATE WHO APPLIES FOR THE**  
27 **RENEWAL OF A PERMIT IS NOT REQUIRED TO BE FINGERPRINTED UNLESS THE**  
28 **SECRETARY REQUIRES A SET OF THE OFFICER'S FINGERPRINTS TO RESOLVE A**  
29 **QUESTION OF THE OFFICER'S IDENTITY.**

30 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
31 October 1, 2016.
