A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Inmate Training and Job Act of 2021**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Inmate Training and Job Pilot Program at certain
4 institutions of postsecondary education; providing for the purpose of the Pilot
5 Program; providing for the administration of the Pilot Program; requiring the
6 Commissioner of Correction to adopt certain regulations to implement the Pilot
7 Program; requiring the Pilot Program to have certain individualized plans that
8 specify a certain staff member to serve as a primary contact; requiring the primary
9 contact to select at least a certain number of students who meet certain qualifications
10 to serve as Pilot Program mentors; requiring certain student mentors to receive
11 course credit and a stipend; requiring the primary contact to meet with an inmate
12 regularly to ensure that the inmate receives certain support; requiring the primary
13 contact to work with the Division of Correction for a certain purpose; requiring
14 certain governing entities to ensure that Pilot Program courses meet certain
15 standards; requiring Pilot Program courses to be provided through a virtual format
16 and subject to certain regulations; requiring each inmate who participates in the
17 Pilot Program to provide the Maryland Higher Education Commission with certain
18 updates for a certain period of time; requiring the Commission to establish a certain
19 hotline; requiring the Commission to connect a Pilot Program participant with
20 certain nonprofit organizations under certain circumstances in a certain manner;
21 requiring the Commission to encourage former Pilot Program participants to serve
22 as contacts for future participants; requiring the Governor, in certain fiscal years, to
23 include in the annual budget bill certain appropriations for the Pilot Program and
24 specifying the uses of the appropriated funds; requiring certain governing entities to
25 report on or before a certain date in certain years to the Commission on the number
26 of inmates enrolled in the Pilot Program; requiring that, subject to a certain
27 minimum participant limit, funds be allocated to certain institutions of
28 postsecondary education on a pro rata basis; requiring the Commission on or before
29 certain dates to submit certain reports to the Governor and General Assembly;
30 defining certain terms; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally
31 relating to the Inmate Training and Job Pilot Program.

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
13 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article – Correctional Services**

15 **3–611.**

16 (A) THE COMMISSIONER SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO IMPLEMENT THE
17 INMATE TRAINING AND JOB PILOT PROGRAM ESTABLISHED UNDER TITLE 24,
18 SUBTITLE 13 OF THE EDUCATION ARTICLE.

19 (B) THE REGULATIONS ADOPTED UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL INCLUDE
20 TERMS OF DEDUCTION FOR PILOT PROGRAM PARTICIPATION AND, IF
21 APPROPRIATE, PROVISIONS GOVERNING THE WORK RELEASE OF PILOT PROGRAM
22 PARTICIPANTS.

23 **Article – Education**

24 **SUBTITLE 13. INMATE TRAINING AND JOB PILOT PROGRAM.**

25 **24–1301.**

26 (A) IN THIS SUBTITLE THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS
27 INDICATED.

28 (B) “COMMISSION” MEANS THE MARYLAND HIGHER EDUCATION
29 COMMISSION.

30 (C) “DIVISION” MEANS THE DIVISION OF CORRECTION WITHIN THE
31 DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND CORRECTIONAL SERVICES.

1 (D) "GOVERNING ENTITY" MEANS:

2 (1) THE PRESIDENT OF BOWIE STATE UNIVERSITY;

3 (2) THE PRESIDENT OF COPPIN STATE UNIVERSITY;

4 (3) THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF MORGAN STATE UNIVERSITY;

5 (4) THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND EASTERN
6 SHORE; AND

7 (5) THE PRESIDENT, BOARD OF TRUSTEES, BOARD OF REGENTS, OR
8 ANY OTHER HEAD OF AN INSTITUTION OF POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION AT WHICH
9 THE COMMISSION ESTABLISHES A PILOT PROGRAM UNDER § 24-1302 OF THIS
10 SUBTITLE.

11 (E) "INSTITUTION OF POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION" HAS THE MEANING
12 STATED IN § 10-101 OF THIS ARTICLE.

13 (F) "PILOT PROGRAM" MEANS THE INMATE TRAINING AND JOB PILOT
14 PROGRAM.

15 24-1302.

16 (A) (1) THERE IS AN INMATE TRAINING AND JOB PILOT PROGRAM AT:

17 (I) BOWIE STATE UNIVERSITY;

18 (II) COPPIN STATE UNIVERSITY;

19 (III) MORGAN STATE UNIVERSITY; AND

20 (IV) THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND EASTERN SHORE.

21 (2) THE COMMISSION MAY ESTABLISH A PILOT PROGRAM AT AN
22 INSTITUTION OF POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION NOT LISTED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1)
23 OF THIS SUBSECTION THROUGH A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING.

24 (B) THE PURPOSE OF EACH PILOT PROGRAM IS TO PROVIDE EDUCATIONAL
25 AND VOCATIONAL TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES FOR AN INMATE IN THE 9 MONTHS
26 PRECEDING THE INMATE'S DATE OF RELEASE.

27 (C) THE PILOT PROGRAM SHALL BE ADMINISTERED JOINTLY BY THE

1 COMMISSION AND THE GOVERNING ENTITY OF EACH INSTITUTION OF
2 POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION, WITH THE COOPERATION OF THE DIVISION.

3 24-1303.

4 (A) (1) EACH PILOT PROGRAM SHALL HAVE AN INDIVIDUALIZED PLAN
5 DESIGNED TO PREPARE THE INMATE FOR SUCCESS ON RELEASE.

6 (2) THE INDIVIDUALIZED PLAN SHALL SPECIFY A PROFESSOR OR
7 OTHER STAFF MEMBER AT THE INSTITUTION OF POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION WHO
8 SHALL SERVE AS THE PRIMARY CONTACT RESPONSIBLE FOR EACH INMATE'S
9 PARTICIPATION AND EDUCATION IN THE PILOT PROGRAM.

10 (3) (I) THE PRIMARY CONTACT SHALL SELECT AT LEAST THREE
11 STUDENTS TO SERVE AS PILOT PROGRAM MENTORS WHO ARE:

12 1. AT LEAST 18 YEARS OLD;

13 2. ENROLLED IN THE INSTITUTION OF POSTSECONDARY
14 EDUCATION; AND

15 3. IF A PILOT PROGRAM IS LOCATED AT A 4-YEAR
16 INSTITUTION OF POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION, ENROLLED IN THEIR JUNIOR OR
17 SENIOR YEAR.

18 (II) A STUDENT WHO PARTICIPATES IN THE PILOT PROGRAM
19 SHALL RECEIVE COURSE CREDIT AND A SMALL STIPEND FROM THE PILOT
20 PROGRAM.

21 (4) TO ENSURE THAT THE INMATE RECEIVES THE SUPPORT
22 NECESSARY TO SUCCEED, THE PRIMARY CONTACT SHALL MEET WITH THE INMATE
23 REGULARLY DURING THE INMATE'S PARTICIPATION IN THE PILOT PROGRAM.

24 (5) THE PRIMARY CONTACT SHALL WORK WITH THE DIVISION TO
25 ENSURE THAT THE TIMING OF COURSE PARTICIPATION AND PILOT PROGRAM
26 MEETINGS WORKS WITH AN INMATE'S SCHEDULE.

27 (B) EACH GOVERNING ENTITY SHALL ENSURE THAT AN INMATE
28 PARTICIPATING IN THE PILOT PROGRAM IS ENROLLED IN A COURSE OR COURSES
29 THAT:

30 (1) ARE CREDIT BEARING AND MAY CONTRIBUTE TO COURSE
31 GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS FOR AN INSTITUTION OF POSTSECONDARY

1 EDUCATION; OR

2 (2) EITHER IN ISOLATION OR AS PART OF A SERIES OF COURSES, LEAD
3 TO AN INDUSTRY-RECOGNIZED CERTIFICATE OR LICENSE.

4 (C) COURSES PROVIDED UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL BE:

5 (1) PROVIDED THROUGH A VIRTUAL FORMAT; AND

6 (2) SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE COMMISSIONER OF
7 CORRECTION UNDER § 3-611 OF THE CORRECTIONAL SERVICES ARTICLE.

8 24-1304.

9 (A) (1) EACH INMATE WHO PARTICIPATES IN THE PILOT PROGRAM
10 SHALL AGREE TO PROVIDE THE COMMISSION WITH REGULAR UPDATES FOR 2 YEARS
11 FOLLOWING THE INMATE'S RELEASE.

12 (2) UPDATES PROVIDED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION SHALL INCLUDE
13 INFORMATION ABOUT THE PILOT PROGRAM PARTICIPANT'S EMPLOYMENT,
14 ENROLLMENT IN POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION COURSES, AND LICENSURE OR
15 CERTIFICATION.

16 (B) THE COMMISSION SHALL ESTABLISH A HOTLINE FOR PARTICIPANTS IN
17 THE PILOT PROGRAM THROUGH WHICH A FORMER INMATE MAY BE CONNECTED TO
18 COUNSELING AND JOB SERVICES.

19 (C) (1) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, BEFORE A
20 PILOT PROGRAM PARTICIPANT'S RELEASE, THE COMMISSION SHALL CONNECT A
21 PARTICIPANT WITH A NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION THAT SERVES INDIVIDUALS IN
22 THE COMMUNITY WHERE THE PARTICIPANT PLANS TO RESIDE.

23 (2) THE COMMISSION SHALL CONNECT A PARTICIPANT WITH A
24 NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION ONLY IF THE PARTICIPANT DESIRES THE AID OF A
25 NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION WHOSE MISSION INCLUDES AID WITH:

26 (I) JOB PLACEMENT;

27 (II) HOUSING SERVICES; OR

28 (III) COUNSELING SERVICES.

29 (3) THE COMMISSION SHALL FACILITATE PILOT PROGRAM

1 PARTICIPANT CONTACT WITH THE APPROPRIATE NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION.

2 (D) THE COMMISSION SHALL ENCOURAGE FORMER PILOT PROGRAM
3 PARTICIPANTS TO SERVE AS CONTACTS FOR FUTURE PILOT PROGRAM
4 PARTICIPANTS.

5 24-1305.

6 (A) THE GOVERNOR SHALL INCLUDE IN THE ANNUAL BUDGET BILL AN
7 APPROPRIATION FOR THE PILOT PROGRAM IN THE AMOUNT OF:

8 (1) \$125,000 IN FISCAL YEAR 2023;

9 (2) \$137,500 IN FISCAL YEAR 2024;

10 (3) \$151,250 IN FISCAL YEAR 2025; AND

11 (4) \$151,250 IN FISCAL YEAR 2026.

12 (B) FUNDING APPROPRIATED UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL BE PROVIDED
13 TO:

14 (1) THE COMMISSION FOR:

15 (I) COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE
16 PILOT PROGRAM, INCLUDING A DESIGNATED EMPLOYEE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE
17 ADMINISTRATION OF THE PILOT PROGRAM;

18 (II) GRANTS MADE TO INSTITUTIONS OF POSTSECONDARY
19 EDUCATION THAT PARTICIPATE IN THE PILOT PROGRAM; AND

20 (III) STIPENDS PROVIDED TO STUDENT MENTORS WHO
21 PARTICIPATE IN THE PILOT PROGRAM; AND

22 (2) THE DIVISION FOR COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE
23 ADMINISTRATION OF THE PILOT PROGRAM WITHIN THE DIVISION, INCLUDING A
24 DESIGNATED EMPLOYEE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE PILOT
25 PROGRAM.

26 (C) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 15, 2022, AND EACH DECEMBER 15
27 THROUGH 2026, A GOVERNING ENTITY SHALL REPORT TO THE COMMISSION ON THE
28 NUMBER OF INMATES ENROLLED IN THE PILOT PROGRAM AT THE INSTITUTION IN
29 THE CURRENT ACADEMIC YEAR.

1 **(D) (1) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, EACH YEAR**
2 **THE COMMISSION SHALL ALLOCATE FUNDS TO INSTITUTIONS OF POSTSECONDARY**
3 **EDUCATION THAT PARTICIPATE IN THE PILOT PROGRAM ON A PRO RATA BASIS,**
4 **ACCORDING TO THE MOST RECENT ENROLLMENT DATA REQUIRED UNDER**
5 **SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION.**

6 **(2) AN INSTITUTION OF POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION MUST ENROLL**
7 **AT LEAST 10 INMATES TO QUALIFY FOR AN ALLOCATION OF FUNDS UNDER THIS**
8 **SUBSECTION.**

9 **24-1306.**

10 **(A) (1) ON OR BEFORE JULY 1, 2024, THE COMMISSION, IN**
11 **CONSULTATION WITH THE DIVISION, SHALL SUBMIT AN INTERIM REPORT TO THE**
12 **GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1257 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT**
13 **ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON THE PROGRESS OF THE PILOT PROGRAM.**

14 **(2) ON OR BEFORE JULY 1, 2028, THE COMMISSION, IN**
15 **CONSULTATION WITH THE DIVISION, SHALL SUBMIT A FINAL REPORT TO THE**
16 **GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1257 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT**
17 **ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON THE PROGRESS OF THE PILOT PROGRAM.**

18 **(B) THE REPORTS REQUIRED UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL INCLUDE THE**
19 **FOLLOWING INFORMATION ON PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS:**

20 **(1) THE COURSES IN WHICH A PARTICIPANT ENROLLED;**

21 **(2) POST-CONFINEMENT EMPLOYMENT OF A PARTICIPANT;**

22 **(3) POST-CONFINEMENT CONTINUING EDUCATION OF A**
23 **PARTICIPANT; AND**

24 **(4) POST-CONFINEMENT CERTIFICATION OR LICENSURE OF A**
25 **PARTICIPANT.**

26 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
27 1, 2021. It shall remain effective for a period of 7 years and, at the end of June 30, 2028,
28 this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and
29 of no further force and effect.
