Transportation – Maryland Transportation Authority – Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety and Accessibility

- 4 FOR the purpose of repealing a prohibition on pedestrians using a highway of the Maryland Transportation Authority; altering a prohibition on bicycles using an Authority 5 6 highway; requiring the Authority to construct separated or buffered bicycle ways and 7 pedestrian walkways in certain locations under certain circumstances; authorizing 8 the Authority to seek a waiver from the Secretary of Transportation from certain 9 requirements under this Act; requiring the Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory 10 Committee to review waiver requests under this Act and provide recommendations 11 to the Secretary; and generally relating to the construction of bicycle ways and pedestrian walkways on Authority bridges and highways. 12

- 8 **[(i)] (J)** A member of the Committee may not receive compensation but shall be reimbursed for expenses under the Standard State Travel Regulations, as provided for in the State budget.
- 11 **[(j)] (K)** The Department shall provide staff, administrative support, and operating expenses for the Committee as provided in the State budget.
