## Public Health - Abortion-Inducing Drugs

3 FOR the purpose of providing for the circumstances under and the manner in which a person may provide an abortion-inducing drug to a pregnant woman; establishing 4 5 reporting requirements related to the use of abortion-inducing drugs in the State; 6 requiring the Maryland Department of Health to develop a certain form and publish 7 certain information on the use of abortion-inducing drugs in the State; providing for 8 the manner in which a civil action or disciplinary action may be brought under this 9 Act; authorizing certain State representatives to participate in certain legal actions in a certain manner; and generally relating to the use of abortion-inducing drugs. 10
