1 AN ACT concerning

Department of Agriculture - Invasive Plants - Labeling and Notice

3 FOR the purpose of designating certain species of plant as invasive plants; authorizing 4 the Department of Agriculture to designate certain additional species of plant 5 as invasive species if the species meet certain criteria; prohibiting a person, 6 except as provided under this Act, from selling or offering for sale in the State, 7 or from planting or supplying as part of a certain landscaping service in the 8 State, invasive plants; requiring each container of invasive plant sold or offered 9 for sale in the State to have attached a certain label containing certain 10 information in a certain form; requiring a retail display of invasive plants to include a certain sign containing certain information; requiring the Department 11 12 to develop a certain sign and provide it at no cost to certain retailers; requiring 13 a person, before supplying or planting an invasive plant as part of a certain 14 landscaping service, to give a certain customer certain notice; requiring the 15 notice to contain certain information in a certain form; prohibiting a person 16 from concealing, detaching, altering, defacing, or destroying a certain label, 17 sign, or notice; requiring the Secretary of Agriculture to adopt certain 18 regulations; requiring the Secretary to provide a certain person with certain 19 notice of a suspected violation of this Act; requiring the Secretary to provide a 20 certain person with an opportunity to dispute a suspected violation of this Act; 21providing that a person who violates the provisions of this Act is guilty of a 22 misdemeanor and, on conviction, is subject to a certain fine; defining certain 23 terms; and generally relating to regulation of invasive plants.

- THE SECRETARY SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THE
- 11 PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBTITLE.

- 13 (A) THE SECRETARY SHALL:
- 14 (1) NOTIFY, IN WRITING, A PERSON SUSPECTED OF VIOLATING
- 15 THIS SUBTITLE OF THE SUSPECTED VIOLATION; AND
- 16 (2) PROVIDE A PERSON SUSPECTED OF VIOLATING THIS
- 17 SUBTITLE WITH AN OPPORTUNITY TO DISPUTE THE VIOLATION.
- 18 (B) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES ANY PROVISION OF THIS SUBTITLE IS
- 19 GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO A FINE NOT
