FOR the purpose of requiring the regulations adopted by the State Board of Education to 4 5 govern the licensing and operation of child care centers to include provisions that 6 establish certain qualifications for child care teachers and require each child care 7 center employee to complete certain training within a certain number of days after 8 the individual is hired; requiring the State Department of Education to review an 9 individual's qualifications for employment in a child care center and approve or deny the application within a certain period of time; and generally relating to the 10 11 qualifications of child care center employees.

- 27 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,



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1 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

2 Article - Education 3 9.5 - 404.4 (a) The State Board shall adopt rules and regulations for licensing and operating 5 child care centers. 6 (b) These rules and regulations shall: 7 (10)Require a child care center to have a written emergency preparedness plan for emergency situations that require evacuation, sheltering in place, or 8 other protection of children, such as in the event of fire, natural disaster, or other 9 threatening situation that may pose a health or safety hazard to the children in the child 10 11 care center: 12(ii) Require the plan under item (i) of this item to include: 13 1. A designated relocation site and evacuation route; 14 Procedures for notifying parents or other adults responsible for the child of the relocation; 15 16 3. Procedures to address the needs of individual children, 17 including children with special needs; 18 4. Procedures for the reassignment of staff duties during an 19 emergency, as appropriate; and 20 5. Procedures for communicating with local emergency 21management officials or other appropriate State or local authorities; and 22 Require a child care center to train staff and ensure that staff are (iii) familiar with the plan; [and] 23 24Require a child care center to have window coverings in accordance with (11)§ 5-505 of the Family Law Article; 25 26 (12) ESTABLISH QUALIFICATIONS FOR CHILD CARE TEACHERS THAT 27 ALLOW AN INDIVIDUAL WHO HOLDS AN ASSOCIATE DEGREE OR BACHELOR'S 28 DEGREE TO QUALIFY AS A CHILD CARE LEAD TEACHER IF THE INDIVIDUAL 29 SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETES THE REQUIRED 90 HOURS OF APPROVED PRE-SERVICE TRAINING WITHIN 6 MONTHS AFTER BEING HIRED; AND 30

(13) REQUIRE EACH CHILD CARE CENTER EMPLOYEE TO COMPLETE,

- WITHIN 90 DAYS AFTER THE DATE THE INDIVIDUAL IS HIRED, APPROVED TRAINING
 IN:
 (I) BASIC HEALTH AND SAFETY;
 (II) AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT COMPLIANCE; AND
 (III) SUPPORTING BREASTFEEDING PRACTICES.

- WITHIN 14 DAYS AFTER RECEIVING A COMPLETE APPLICATION, THE BEPARTMENT SHALL REVIEW AN INDIVIDUAL'S QUALIFICATIONS FOR EMPLOYMENT
- 9 IN A CHILD CARE CENTER AND APPROVE OR DENY THE APPLICATION.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2020.
