A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Public Schools - Cyber Safety Guide and Training Course - Development, Implementation, and Reporting

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Department of Education, the Behavioral Health $\mathbf{5}$ Administration within the Maryland Department of Health, the Maryland Center 6 for School Safety, and the Department of Information Technology jointly to develop 7 and publish a cyber safety guide and training course to be implemented in public 8 schools beginning in a certain school year; requiring the cyber safety guide and 9 training course to be developed in consultation with certain professionals; requiring the cyber safety guide to be posted on the websites of the State Department of 10 11 Education and the Maryland Center for School Safety and distributed to each county 12board of education; authorizing a county board to offer credit on completion of the 13 training course; and generally relating to the development and implementation of a cyber safety guide and training course in public schools. 14

- 20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 21 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

24 (A) (1) ON OR BEFORE JULY 1, 2023, THE DEPARTMENT, THE 25 BEHAVIORAL HEALTH ADMINISTRATION WITHIN THE MARYLAND DEPARTMENT OF

11 **(B)** THE CYBER SAFETY GUIDE AND TRAINING COURSE UNDER THIS 12 SECTION SHALL:

13(1) BE DEVELOPED IN CONSULTATION WITH PROFESSIONALS WHO14SPECIALIZE IN CHILD DEVELOPMENT AND CHILD PSYCHOLOGY; AND

15(2) INCLUDE INFORMATION AND BEST PRACTICES THAT PROMOTE16RESPONSIBLE INTERNET USE THROUGH PREVENTION AND MANAGEMENT OF:

- (I) CYBERBULLYING;

18(II) CONTENT DEPICTING OR ENCOURAGING SUICIDE OR19SELF-HARM;

- 20 (III) HATE SPEECH;
- 21 (IV) SEXUALLY GRAPHIC CONTENT;
- 22 (V) SALES OF ILLEGAL SUBSTANCES;
- 23 (VI) IDENTITY THEFT AND CYBERSECURITY THREATS;
- 24 (VII) DISSEMINATION OF FALSE INFORMATION; AND

(VIII) NEGATIVE IMPACTS OF SOCIAL MEDIA AND TECHNOLOGY
USAGE ON BEHAVIORAL AND PHYSICAL HEALTH.

1 (1) POSTED ON THE WEBSITES OF THE DEPARTMENT AND THE 2 MARYLAND CENTER FOR SCHOOL SAFETY; AND

- 3 (2) DISTRIBUTED TO EACH COUNTY BOARD.
- 4 (D) THE CYBER SAFETY TRAINING COURSE SHALL:

5 (1) BE UPDATED EACH YEAR AND AVAILABLE ON THE DEPARTMENT'S 6 WEBSITE;

7 (2) BE SELF-GUIDED;

8 (3) INCLUDE SEPARATE TRAINING COMPONENTS FOR STUDENTS, 9 PARENTS, AND SCHOOL EMPLOYEES;

10 (4) OFFER A CERTIFICATE ON COURSE COMPLETION; AND

11(5) INCLUDE A PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT COMPONENT THAT12SATISFIES SCHOOL ACCREDITATION STANDARDS AND PERSONNEL CERTIFICATION13REQUIREMENTS.

14 (E) THE CYBER SAFETY TRAINING COURSE MAY INCORPORATE OTHER 15 STATE, FEDERAL, NONPROFIT, OR PUBLIC TRAINING MODULES.

16(F) A COUNTY BOARD MAY OFFER STUDENTS CREDIT FOR THE COMPLETION17OF THE CYBER SAFETY TRAINING COURSE.

18 (G) EACH YEAR, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL:

19(1)SEND A LIST OF AVAILABLE ONLINE TRAINING MODULES AND ANY20UPDATES TO ONLINE TRAINING TO EACH COUNTY BOARD; AND

(2) COMPILE DATA FROM EACH COUNTY BOARD ON THE NUMBER OF STAFF AND STUDENTS BY GRADE LEVEL WHO HAVE RECEIVED CERTIFICATION OR CREDIT FOR COMPLETING THE CYBER SAFETY TRAINING COURSE.

24 (H) THE STATE BOARD MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS TO IMPLEMENT THIS 25 SECTION.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before July 1, 2023, the State Department of Education, the Behavioral Health Administration within the Maryland Department of Health, the Maryland Center for School Safety, and the Department of Information Technology shall report to the General Assembly in accordance

with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article on the development of the cyber safety guide
and training course for students, parents, and teachers.

3 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 4 1, 2022.
