19 20	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND. That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 2 (a) There is a Class C (fraternal/sororal/service organization) beer, wine, and 3 liquor license.
- 4 (b) The Board may issue the license for use by a local unit of a lodge [or], A chapter of a nonprofit and nationwide fraternal, sororal, or service organization, OR A VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT that:
- 7 (1) **EXCEPT FOR A VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT,** is composed solely 8 of inducted members;
- 9 (2) was operating in the county before the license application was made;
- 10 (3) **EXCEPT FOR A VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT,** has at least 100 members paying dues of at least \$5 per year per member; and
- 12 (4) owns or operates a home [or], clubhouse, **OR FIREHOUSE** that is principally for the use of its members and guests when accompanied by members.
- 14 (c) (1) The license authorizes the license holder to sell beer, wine, and liquor for on–premises consumption by a member or guest accompanied by a member.
- 16 (2) The license holder may allow a person that has leased a private room 17 or other area of the licensed premises for a private social gathering to bring beer, wine, and 18 liquor onto the licensed premises for on–premises consumption.
- 19 (d) The license holder may sell beer, wine, and liquor during the hours and days 20 as set out for a Class C beer, wine, and liquor license under § 26–2004 of this title, except 21 that restrictions on the sale of alcoholic beverages on Sunday do not apply.
- 22 (e) The annual license fee is \$910.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2018.
