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## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **State Emergency Medical Services Board – Park Services Associates –**  
3 **Certification as Emergency Medical Responders**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Emergency Medical Services Board to credit certain  
5 training and education completed by a certain park services associate toward  
6 certification as an emergency medical responder; prohibiting the EMS Board from  
7 charging certain fees to any individual who is a certain park services associate;  
8 providing for the issuance of temporary certification as an emergency medical  
9 responder to certain park services associates and a process for issuing permanent  
10 certification to certain park services associates under certain circumstances; and  
11 generally relating to park services associates and certification as emergency medical  
12 responders.

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
2 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 **Article – Education**

4 13–516.

5 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

6 (5) “Emergency medical responder” means an individual who has:

7 (i) Completed an emergency medical responder course approved by  
8 the EMS Board, or its equivalent as determined by the EMS Board;

9 (ii) Demonstrated competence in medical protocols as determined by  
10 the EMS Board;

11 (iii) Been examined by the EMS Board or by a basic life support  
12 education program approved by the EMS Board; and

13 (iv) Been certified as an emergency medical responder by the EMS  
14 Board.

15 **(B–2) THE EMS BOARD SHALL CREDIT ANY TRAINING AND EDUCATION**  
16 **COMPLETED BY A PARK SERVICES ASSOCIATE EMPLOYED BY THE PARK SERVICE**  
17 **WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES TOWARD ANY TRAINING OR**  
18 **EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTIFICATION AS AN EMERGENCY MEDICAL**  
19 **RESPONDER BY THE EMS BOARD IF THE TRAINING OR EDUCATION IS DETERMINED**  
20 **BY THE EMS BOARD TO BE:**

21 **(1) SUBSTANTIALLY EQUIVALENT TO THE TRAINING OR EDUCATION**  
22 **REQUIRED BY THE EMS BOARD; AND**

23 **(2) NOT OTHERWISE CONTRARY TO ANY OTHER LICENSING**  
24 **REQUIREMENT.**

25 (c) (1) To apply for a license or certificate, an individual shall:

26 (i) Submit an application on the form that the EMS Board requires;  
27 and

28 (ii) Pay to the EMS Board any application fee set by the EMS Board  
29 under subsection (m) of this section.

1           (2)    **(I)**    The EMS Board may not charge a licensing, certifying, testing,  
2 or retesting fee to any individual who is a member or employee of any governmental or  
3 volunteer fire, rescue, or emergency medical services company at the date of application.

4                           **(II) THE EMS BOARD MAY NOT CHARGE A LICENSING,  
5 CERTIFYING, TESTING, OR RETESTING FEE FOR CERTIFICATION AS AN EMERGENCY  
6 MEDICAL RESPONDER TO ANY INDIVIDUAL WHO IS A PARK SERVICES ASSOCIATE  
7 EMPLOYED BY THE PARK SERVICE WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL  
8 RESOURCES AT THE DATE OF APPLICATION.**

9           (3)    The EMS Board shall provide for the term and renewal of licenses or  
10 certificates issued under this section.

11           SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

12           (a)    (1)    Beginning on the effective date of this Act, each State employee  
13 classified as a park services associate in the Park Service within the Department of Natural  
14 Resources who submits proof to the State Emergency Medical Services Board of completing  
15 training or education that is equivalent to the training or education required for  
16 certification as an emergency medical responder shall be deemed to have a temporary  
17 certification as an emergency medical responder.

18           (2)    The Department may not charge a fee or require the passage of an  
19 examination for the temporary certification of a park services associate who meets the  
20 requirements under paragraph (1) of this subsection.

21           (3)    Temporary certification under paragraph (1) of this subsection expires  
22 on December 31, 2024.

23           (4)    To receive certification as an emergency medical responder after  
24 temporary certification expires under paragraph (3) of this subsection, an individual shall  
25 apply for certification under § 13–516 of the Education Article.

26           (b)    (1)    On or before July 1, 2023, the State Emergency Medical Services Board  
27 shall complete a review of the training records for all park services associates in the Park  
28 Service to identify those individuals whose training meets the training requirements for  
29 certification as an emergency medical responder under § 13–516 of the Education Article.

30           (2)    On or before July 1, 2024, the EMS Board shall offer at least twice to  
31 each individual identified under paragraph (1) of this subsection:

32                           (i)    the examination for certification as an emergency medical  
33 responder administered by the EMS Board; and

34                           (ii)   information regarding any other requirements the individual is  
35 required to meet in order to become a certified emergency medical responder.

1           SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency  
2 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has  
3 been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to  
4 each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is  
5 enacted.
