1 AN ACT concerning

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Hospitals - Patient's Bill of Rights

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring each administrator of a hospital to provide patients with a 4 certain patient's bill of rights; requiring each administrator of a hospital to provide certain patients with a translator, an interpreter, or another accommodation to $\mathbf{5}$ 6 provide certain assistance to patients; requiring each administrator of a hospital to 7 conspicuously post copies of the patient's bill of rights on the hospital's website and 8 in areas of the hospital accessible to patients and visitors; requiring each 9 administrator of a hospital to provide annual training to certain staff members to 10 ensure the staff's knowledge and understanding of the patient's bill of rights; 11 requiring a certain statement to be written in plain language; altering the rights 12that are required to be included in a patient's bill of rights; requiring the Office of 13Health Care Quality to monitor certain compliance; requiring the Office to report to 14 the General Assembly on or before a certain date each year; declaring the intent of the General Assembly; defining a certain term; making a technical change; and 1516generally relating to hospitals and a patient's bill of rights.

 THE CARE, AND THE BENEFITS AND RISKS OF THE ALTERNATIVES TO THE CARE;

26 (20) AGREE OR REFUSE TO TAKE PART IN MEDICAL RESEARCH 27 STUDIES, WITHOUT THE AGREEMENT OR REFUSAL AFFECTING THE PATIENT'S CARE;

28 (21) ALLOW OR REFUSE TO ALLOW PICTURES OF THE PATIENT FOR 29 PURPOSES OTHER THAN THE PATIENT'S CARE;

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1 (22) EXPECT PRIVACY AND CONFIDENTIALITY IN CARE DISCUSSIONS 2 AND TREATMENTS;

3 (23) BE PROVIDED A COPY OF THE HEALTH INSURANCE PORTABILITY 4 AND ACCOUNTABILITY ACT NOTICE OF PRIVACY PRACTICES; AND

5 (24) FILE A COMPLAINT ABOUT CARE AND HAVE THE COMPLAINT 6 REVIEWED WITHOUT THE COMPLAINT AFFECTING THE PATIENT'S CARE.

7 (E) THE OFFICE OF HEALTH CARE QUALITY SHALL MONITOR THE 8 COMPLIANCE OF EACH HOSPITAL WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION.

9 (F) ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1 EACH YEAR JANUARY 1, 2021, THE OFFICE 10 OF HEALTH CARE QUALITY SHALL REPORT TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, IN 11 ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, ON THE 12 COMPLIANCE OF HOSPITALS WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION.
