AN ACT concerning
<u>Maggie McIntosh</u> School Arts Fund – Established
FOR the purpose of establishing the <u>Maggie McIntosh</u> School Arts Fund as a special, nonlapsing fund; requiring interest earnings of the Fund to be credited to the Fund; altering the allocation of revenues from the State Lottery Fund after a certain date; and generally relating to the <u>Maggie McIntosh</u> School Arts Fund.
