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## Grant Applications and Reporting - Uniform Forms and Requirements

  16 State Finance and Procurement Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act; and
- 17 (2) on or before December 31 of the calendar years 2022 through 2026, 18 report to the General Assembly on the progress of the implementation of this Act, including 19 any recommendations of the Maryland Efficient Grant Application Council.
- SECTION 4. 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the terms of the initial members appointed to the Maryland Efficient Grant Application Council by the Governor shall expire as follows:
- 23 (1) two members in 2022; and
- 24 (2) <del>two</del> three members in 2024.

SECTION 5. 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
July 1, 2020. It shall remain effective for a period of 5 years and, at the end of June 30,
27 2025, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated
and of no further force and effect.
