1 AN ACT concerning

Aids for the Cessation of Tobacco Product Use – Prescribing and Dispensing by Pharmacists and Health Insurance Coverage

- 4 FOR the purpose of authorizing a pharmacist who meets the requirements of certain $\mathbf{5}$ regulations to prescribe and dispense certain aids for the cessation of the use of 6 tobacco products; requiring the State Board of Pharmacy, on or before a certain date, 7 to adopt regulations establishing certain procedures and conditions relating to the 8 prescribing and dispensing of certain aids for the cessation of the use of tobacco 9 products; altering the definition of "nicotine replacement therapy" to require certain insurers, nonprofit health service plans, and health maintenance organizations to 1011 provide coverage for certain over-the-counter products that may be obtained 12without a prescription; altering certain definitions; providing for a delayed effective 13 date for certain provisions of this Act; providing for the application of certain provisions of this Act; and generally relating to aids for the cessation of the use of 14 15tobacco products.
