- FOR the purpose of establishing the Four–Day Workweek Pilot Program in the Maryland Department of Labor for the purpose of promoting, incentivizing, and supporting the experimentation and study of the use of a 4–day workweek by private and public employers; requiring governmental units that institute 4–day workweeks to provide information requested by the Department; allowing certain qualifying employers who participate in the Program to claim a certain credit against the State income tax; and generally relating to the Four–Day Workweek Pilot Program.

- 5 (4) CONDUCT AND PROMOTE RESEARCH ON 4-DAY WORKWEEKS THAT
- 6 EXIST OUTSIDE THE PROGRAM, INCLUDING 4-DAY WORKWEEKS ESTABLISHED
- 7 INTERNATIONALLY;
- 8 (5) FACILITATE PUBLIC DISCUSSION WITH QUALIFYING EMPLOYERS
- 9 AND GOVERNMENTAL UNITS THAT HAVE INSTITUTED A 4-DAY WORKWEEK; AND
- 10 (6) PUBLISH THE DATA AND REPORTS REQUIRED UNDER THIS

- 12 (D) A GOVERNMENTAL UNIT THAT INSTITUTES A 4-DAY WORKWEEK SHALL
- 13 PROVIDE ANY INFORMATION REQUESTED BY THE DEPARTMENT FOR THE PURPOSE
- 14 OF THE DEPARTMENT COMPLYING WITH SUBSECTION (C)(3) OF THIS SECTION.
- 15 (E) FOR EACH OF FISCAL YEARS 2025 THROUGH 2028, THE GOVERNOR
- 16 SHALL INCLUDE IN THE ANNUAL BUDGET BILL AN APPROPRIATION OF \$250,000 TO

- 25 WORKFORCE OR A DIVISION OF THE APPLICANT'S WORKFORCE FROM A 5-DAY
- 26 WORKWEEK TO A 4-DAY WORKWEEK; AND
- 27 (II) ANY OTHER INFORMATION REQUIRED BY THE
- 28 **DEPARTMENT.**

- 1 (B) A PROPOSAL INCLUDED IN AN APPLICATION UNDER SUBSECTION 2 (A)(2)(I) OF THIS SECTION SHALL:
- 3 (1) APPLY TO AT LEAST 30 EMPLOYEES; AND
- 4 (2) INCLUDE INFORMATION INDICATING THAT THE APPLICANT DID
- 5 NOT HAVE ANY PRIOR INTENTION OF TRANSITIONING ITS WORKFORCE OR A
- 6 DIVISION OF ITS WORKFORCE FROM A 5-DAY WORKWEEK TO A 4-DAY WORKWEEK.
- 7 (C) THE DEPARTMENT MAY ACCEPT AN APPLICATION FOR PARTICIPATION 8 IN THE PROGRAM IF THE APPLICANT ENTERS AN AGREEMENT:
- 9 (1) PROVIDING THAT AN EMPLOYEE TRANSITIONING TO A 4-DAY 10 WORKWEEK WILL NOT RECEIVE A REDUCTION IN PAY OR BENEFITS; AND
- 11 (2) ALLOWING THE DEPARTMENT TO RESEARCH THE IMPACT OF
- 12 TRANSITIONING TO A 4-DAY WORKWEEK THROUGH EMPLOYEE SURVEYS,
- 13 INTERVIEWS, AND OTHER INFORMATION GATHERING.

- 15 (A) (1) SUBJECT TO THE LIMITATIONS OF THIS SECTION AND § 10–757 OF
- 16 THE TAX GENERAL ARTICLE, A QUALIFYING EMPLOYER MAY CLAIM A CREDIT
- 17 AGAINST THE STATE INCOME TAX IN THE AMOUNT STATED ON THE TAX CREDIT
- 18 CERTIFICATE ISSUED BY THE DEPARTMENT UNDER THIS SECTION.
- 19 **(2)** THE DEPARTMENT MAY ISSUE A TAX CREDIT CERTIFICATE TO A 20 QUALIFYING EMPLOYER THAT:
- 21 (I) PARTICIPATES IN THE PROGRAM FOR AT LEAST 1 YEAR; AND
- 22 (II) SUBMITS A REPORT TO THE DEPARTMENT DETAILING ITS
- 23 TRANSITION TO A 4-DAY WORKWEEK.
- 24 (3) BEFORE ISSUING A TAX CREDIT CERTIFICATE, THE DEPARTMENT
- 25 SHALL CONFIRM THAT THE QUALIFYING EMPLOYER HAS MAINTAINED COMPLIANCE
- 26 WITH ITS PROPOSAL TO PARTICIPATE IN THE PROGRAM.
- 27 (4) THE DEPARTMENT MAY NOT ISSUE TO ANY QUALIFYING
- 28 EMPLOYER MORE THAN TWO TAX CREDIT CERTIFICATES UNDER THIS SECTION.
- 29 (B) (1) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DETERMINE THE AMOUNT STATED ON 30 A TAX CREDIT CERTIFICATE ISSUED UNDER THIS SECTION.

- 1 (2) THE DEPARTMENT MAY DETERMINE THE AMOUNT STATED ON A 2 TAX CREDIT CERTIFICATE THROUGH THE USE OF:
- 3 (I) A FIXED DOLLAR AMOUNT FOR EACH QUALIFYING 4 EMPLOYER;
- 5 (II) A FIXED DOLLAR AMOUNT FOR EACH EMPLOYEE OF THE
- 6 QUALIFYING EMPLOYER PARTICIPATING IN THE PROGRAM;
- 7 (III) A PERCENTAGE OF THE WAGES PAID TO EACH EMPLOYEE OF
- 8 THE QUALIFYING EMPLOYER PARTICIPATING IN THE PROGRAM; OR
- 9 (IV) A DOLLAR AMOUNT THAT ASSISTS IN OFFSETTING A
- 10 QUALIFYING EMPLOYER'S COSTS TO HIRE NEW EMPLOYEES DUE TO THE
- 11 QUALIFYING EMPLOYER'S PARTICIPATION IN THE PROGRAM.
- 12 (3) THE DEPARTMENT MAY DETERMINE THE AMOUNT STATED ON
- 13 THE TAX CREDIT CERTIFICATE BY USING ANY COMBINATION OF THE OPTIONS
- 14 DESCRIBED UNDER PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION.
- 15 (C) (1) FOR EACH FISCAL YEAR, THE DEPARTMENT MAY NOT ISSUE TAX
- 16 CREDIT CERTIFICATES FOR CREDIT AMOUNTS IN THE AGGREGATE TOTALING MORE
- 17 THAN \$750,000.
- 18 (2) IF THE AGGREGATE AMOUNT OF TAX CREDIT CERTIFICATES
- 19 ISSUED DURING A FISCAL YEAR TOTALS LESS THAN THE MAXIMUM PROVIDED UNDER
- 20 PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION, ANY EXCESS AMOUNT MAY BE ISSUED IN A
- 21 SUBSEQUENT FISCAL YEAR.
- 22 (D) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL:
- 23 (1) ADOPT REGULATIONS THAT ESTABLISH CRITERIA AND
- 24 PROCEDURES FOR:
- 25 (I) ISSUING THE TAX CREDIT CERTIFICATES AUTHORIZED
- 26 UNDER THIS SECTION; AND
- 27 (II) DETERMINING THE AMOUNT OF A TAX CREDIT CERTIFICATE
- 28 ISSUED UNDER THIS SECTION; AND
- 29 (2) ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 31 EACH YEAR, PROVIDE A REPORT TO
- 30 THE COMPTROLLER THAT IDENTIFIES EACH QUALIFIED EMPLOYER THAT WAS

- ISSUED A TAX CREDIT CERTIFICATE DURING THE IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING YEAR 1

- 15 ANY FINDINGS OR RECOMMENDATIONS BASED ON RESEARCH **(5)** CONDUCTED ON 4-DAY WORKWEEKS THAT EXIST IN AND OUTSIDE THE PROGRAM. 16
- 17 (B) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ANNUALLY PUBLISH ON ITS WEBSITE:
- 18 **(1)** THE REPORTS REQUIRED UNDER THIS SECTION; AND
- **4-DAY** 19 **(2)** QUALIFYING EMPLOYERS' THE DETAILS OF THE 20 WORKWEEK PROPOSALS.

- 26 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2023, and shall be applicable to all taxable years beginning after December 31, 2022, but 27
- before January 1, 2028. It shall remain effective for a period of 5 years and, at the end of 28
- June 30, 2028, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be 29
- abrogated and of no further force and effect. 30
