CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

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## Department of Health and Mental Hygiene – Distribution of Tobacco Products to Minors – Prohibition and Enforcement

FOR the purpose of prohibiting certain persons from distributing certain tobacco products, certain paraphernalia, or certain coupons to a minor, with certain exceptions; providing that a person who violates a certain provision of this Act is subject to certain civil penalties; establishing a certain defense in a prosecution for a certain violation; providing that a county health officer, or a designee of a county health officer, may issue a certain civil citation for a violation of a certain provision of this Act; requiring certain civil citations to include certain information and to be processed in a certain manner; providing for a certain election to stand trial; requiring the District Court to remit certain collected penalties in a certain manner; providing that adjudication of a violation of a certain provision of this Act is not a criminal conviction for any purpose; requiring the Comptroller's Office to provide certain information to the Prevention and Health Promotion Administration each year; requiring the Comptroller's Office to provide certain information to the General Assembly on or before a certain date each year; requiring local health departments to report certain violations to the Comptroller's Office; requiring the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, in collaboration and consultation with certain agencies, to develop certain strategies; requiring the Department to report on the development of certain strategies and certain training and assistance on or before a certain date each year; defining a certain term; providing for the application of certain provisions of this Act; and generally relating to prohibitions on the distribution of tobacco products to minors.

- 1 (a) This section does not apply to the distribution of a coupon that is redeemable 2 for a tobacco product, if the coupon is: 3 contained in a newspaper, magazine, or other type of publication in 4 which the coupon is incidental to the primary purpose of the publication; or 5 (2) sent through the mail. 6 (b) (1) This subsection does not apply to the distribution of a tobacco product 7 or tobacco paraphernalia to a minor who is acting solely as the agent of the minor's employer if the employer distributes tobacco products or tobacco paraphernalia for 8 commercial purposes. 9 10 **(2)** A person who distributes tobacco products for commercial purposes, including a person licensed under Title 16 of the Business Regulation Article, may not 11 distribute to a minor: 12 13 (i) a tobacco product; 14 (ii) tobacco paraphernalia; or 15 (iii) a coupon redeemable for a tobacco product. 16 (c) A person not described in subsection (b)(2) of this section may not: 17 (1) purchase for or sell a tobacco product to a minor; or distribute tobacco paraphernalia to a minor. 18 (2) In a prosecution for a violation of this section, it is a defense that the defendant 19 20 examined the purchaser's or recipient's driver's license or other valid identification issued 21by an employer, government unit, or institution of higher education that positively 22identified the purchaser or recipient as at least 18 years of age. 23 A person who violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction 24is subject to a fine not exceeding: \$300 for a first violation; 25 (1) 26 \$1,000 for a second violation occurring within 2 years after the first (2)27 violation; and 28 \$3,000 for each subsequent violation occurring within 2 years after the 29preceding violation.
- 30 (f) For purposes of this section, each separate incident at a different time and 31 occasion is a violation.

- 1 10-108.2 In this section, "violation" has the meaning stated in § 3–8A–01 of the Courts (a) 3 Article. 4 This section does not apply to the possession of a tobacco product or cigarette rolling paper by a minor who is acting as the agent of the minor's employer within the scope 5 6 of employment. 7 (c) A minor may not: 8 (1) use or possess a tobacco product or cigarette rolling paper; or 9 obtain or attempt to obtain a tobacco product or cigarette rolling paper by using a form of identification that: 10 11 (i) is falsified; or 12(ii) identifies an individual other than the minor. A violation of this section is a civil offense. 13 (d) (1) 14 A minor who violates this section is subject to the procedures and 15 dispositions provided in Title 3, Subtitle 8A of the Courts Article. 16 A law enforcement officer authorized to make arrests shall issue a citation to 17 a minor if the law enforcement officer has probable cause to believe that the minor is committing or has committed a violation of this section. 18 19 Article - Health - General 20 24-307. 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- 24 (E) (1) IN THIS SUBSECTION, "DESIGNEE" MEANS A RETIRED SWORN LAW
- 25 ENFORCEMENT OFFICER EMPLOYED BY A COUNTY HEALTH OFFICER OR AN
- 26 EMPLOYEE OF A LOCAL HEALTH DEPARTMENT TRAINED IN CIVIL ENFORCEMENT.
- 27 (2) A COUNTY HEALTH OFFICER OR A DESIGNEE OF A COUNTY
- 28 HEALTH OFFICER MAY ISSUE A CIVIL CITATION FOR A VIOLATION OF SUBSECTION
- 29 (B) OF THIS SECTION.
  - (3) A CITATION ISSUED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION SHALL INCLUDE:

11	1. IS AN ADMISSION OF LIABILITY; AND
12 13 14	2. MAY RESULT IN ENTRY OF A DEFAULT JUDGMENT THAT MAY INCLUDE THE CIVIL PENALTY, COURT COSTS, AND ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES.
15 16	(4) THE COUNTY HEALTH OFFICER OR DESIGNEE SHALL RETAIN A COPY OF THE CITATION ISSUED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION.
17 18 19 20 21	(5) (I) A PERSON WHO RECEIVES A CITATION FROM A COUNTY HEALTH OFFICER OR DESIGNEE UNDER THIS SUBSECTION MAY ELECT TO STAND TRIAL FOR THE VIOLATION BY FILING A NOTICE OF INTENTION TO STAND TRIAL WITH THE COUNTY HEALTH OFFICER OR DESIGNEE AT LEAST 5 DAYS BEFORE THE DATE SET IN THE CITATION FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE CIVIL PENALTY.
22 23 24 25	(II) AFTER RECEIVING A NOTICE OF INTENTION TO STAND TRIAL UNDER SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, THE COUNTY HEALTH OFFICER OR DESIGNEE SHALL FORWARD THE NOTICE AND A COPY OF THE CITATION TO THE DISTRICT COURT.
26 27 28	(6) (I) AFTER RECEIVING A CITATION AND NOTICE UNDER THIS SUBSECTION, THE DISTRICT COURT SHALL SCHEDULE THE CASE FOR TRIAL AND NOTIFY THE DEFENDANT OF THE TRIAL DATE.

29 (II) IN A PROCEEDING BEFORE THE DISTRICT COURT, A 30 VIOLATION OF SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION SHALL BE HANDLED IN THE SAME

MANNER AS A MUNICIPAL INFRACTION UNDER §§ 6–108 THROUGH 6–115 OF THE 1 2 LOCAL GOVERNMENT ARTICLE. 
