# A BILL ENTITLED

#### 1 AN ACT concerning

#### Public Safety – Law Enforcement – Body–Worn Cameras

- FOR the purpose of requiring, on or before a certain date, certain law enforcement agencies
  to adopt policies and procedures for the use of body-worn cameras consistent with
  certain policies developed by the Maryland Police Training and Standards
  Commission; requiring certain law enforcement agencies to issue body-worn
  cameras for certain police officers to use while on duty; making conforming changes;
  and generally relating to law enforcement and body-worn cameras.

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1 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS 2 INDICATED.

3 (2) "LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY" HAS THE MEANING STATED IN § 4 3–201 OF THIS TITLE.

5 (3) "POLICE OFFICER" HAS THE MEANING STATED IN § 3–201 OF THIS 6 TITLE.

7 (B) ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1, 2021, ALL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES 8 SHALL:

9 (1) ADOPT POLICIES AND PROCEDURES FOR THE USE OF BODY–WORN 10 CAMERAS CONSISTENT WITH THE POLICIES DEVELOPED BY THE MARYLAND POLICE 11 TRAINING AND STANDARDS COMMISSION UNDER § 3–511 OF THIS SUBTITLE; AND

12(2)ISSUE BODY-WORN CAMERAS FOR ALL POLICE OFFICERS TO USE13WHILE ON DUTY.
