BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 12 13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Criminal Law 14 5-402.15 16 A material, compound, mixture, or preparation that contains any of 17 the following hallucinogenic or hallucinogenic-like substances is a substance listed in Schedule I: 18 19 (i) bufotenine; 20 (ii) diethyltryptamine; 21dimethyltryptamine; (iii) 22 (iv) 4-methyl-2, 5-dimethoxyamphetamine;

- 25 (2) Unless specifically excepted under this subtitle, a salt, isomer, or salt of an isomer of a substance listed in this subsection is a substance listed in Schedule I if the existence of the salt, isomer, or salt of an isomer is possible within the specific chemical designation.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2011.
