FOR the purpose of defining the term "failing on-site sewage disposal system" for purposes 3 of certain provisions of law relating to on-site sewage disposal systems; requiring 4 each county to adopt by local law or ordinance the definition of "failing on-site $\mathbf{5}$ 6 sewage disposal system"; providing that this Act may not be construed to preempt or 7 prevail over any county ordinance, law, or rule that provides a more stringent definition of the term "failing on-site sewage disposal system"; providing that this 8 9 Act may not be construed to alter a certain enforcement referral method established 10 under a delegation agreement between the Department of the Environment and a 11 local health department except under certain circumstances; and generally relating
