AN ACT concerning
Public Schools - Provision of Menstrual Hygiene Products - Requirement
FOR the purpose of requiring each county board of education to ensure that each public school provide, at no charge to students, menstrual hygiene products via dispensers in the <u>women's</u> restrooms at the school; requiring a public middle or high school to install menstrual hygiene product dispensers in certain restrooms by certain dates; requiring a public elementary school to install menstrual hygiene product dispensers in at least one restroom by a certain date; <u>requiring the State to reimburse each county board for certain costs; requiring each county board to submit to the State Department of Education a request for reimbursement for certain costs on or before certain dates; requiring the Governor to include a certain appropriation in the annual <u>budget bill in a certain fiscal year;</u> defining a certain term; and generally relating to the provision of menstrual hygiene products in public schools.</u>
