# Ethics – Executive Branch – Lobbying by Former Officials and Members of the General Assembly

4 FOR the purpose of altering the time period during which former members of the General Assembly are prohibited from assisting or representing certain parties for  $\mathbf{5}$ 6 compensation in a matter that is subject to legislative action; prohibiting certain 7 former State officials of the Executive Branch and certain former public officials of 8 the Executive Branch from assisting or representing certain parties for compensation, for a certain period of time, in a matter that is subject to legislative 9 10 action; providing an exception to a certain employment prohibition; and generally relating to employment by former members of the General Assembly and former 11 Executive Branch officials. 12
