A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Minority Business Enterprises – Transitioning From Subcontractors to Prime Contractors – Study and Report

- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs and the Office of Minority Business Enterprise in the Maryland Department of Transportation to 5 6 conduct a certain study with certain parties on how the State can assist certain 7 minority business enterprises in transitioning from subcontractors to prime 8 contractors; requiring the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs and the Office of 9 Minority Business Enterprise to report to certain committees of the General 10 Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and 11 generally relating to a study of and report on transitioning minority business enterprises from subcontractors to prime contractors. 12
- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 14 That:
- 15 (a) The Governor's Office of Minority Affairs and the Office of Minority Business 16 Enterprise in the Maryland Department of Transportation shall conduct a study with all 17 interested parties on how the State can assist minority business enterprises in 18 transitioning from subcontractors to prime contractors on State procurements, including:
- 19 (1) construction procurements and all other types of procurements that 20 utilize minority business enterprises; and
- 21 (2) a process for giving credit to former subcontractors that submit bids as 22 prime contractors for satisfactory work performed as subcontractors for other prime 23 contractors under previous State procurements.
- 24 (b) On or before October 1, 2017, the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs and the 25 Office of Minority Business Enterprise shall submit a report to the Senate Education,

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1 Health, and Environmental Affairs Committee and the House Health and Government 2 Operations Committee, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, that 3 includes recommendations on how the State can assist minority business enterprises in 4

transitioning from subcontractors to prime contractors and any regulations or legislation

identified by the study.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2016. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of September 30, 2018, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
