- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing a person who applies for certain property tax exemptions
- 4 for real property in Baltimore City to request that the exemption be applied
- 5 retroactively for a certain period of time, subject to certain requirements; requiring
- Baltimore City and the State to pay a refund of excess real property taxes paid due
- 7 to a retroactive exemption that is granted; and generally relating to property tax

- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 15 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 18 (A) A PERSON WHO APPLIES FOR AN EXEMPTION UNDER § 7–202 OR § 7–204
- 19 OF THIS SUBTITLE FOR REAL PROPERTY IN BALTIMORE CITY MAY REQUEST THAT

- THE EXEMPTION BE APPLIED RETROACTIVELY FOR A PERIOD OF UP TO 3 TAXABLE 1
- YEARS, ENDING WITH THE TAXABLE YEAR IN WHICH THE APPLICATION IS FILED. 2

- 17 ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1, 2023, AND EACH DECEMBER 1 THROUGH **(D)**
- DECEMBER 1, 2027, THE BALTIMORE CITY DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE SHALL 18
- SUBMIT TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1257 OF THE STATE 19
- GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, A REPORT THAT INDICATES: 20
- 21THE NUMBER OF REQUESTS FOR A RETROACTIVE EXEMPTION **(1)**
- 22UNDER THIS SECTION THAT THE BALTIMORE CITY DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE
- RECEIVED AND APPROVED DURING THE IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING YEAR; AND 23
- 24ANY AMOUNTS REFUNDED FOR A RETROACTIVE EXEMPTION **(2)**
- 25UNDER THIS SECTION.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED. That this Act shall take effect June 26
- 27 1.2023.
- 28 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency
- measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has 29
- been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to 30
- 31 each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is
- enacted. It shall remain effective through December 31, 2026, and, at the end of December 32
- 31, 2026, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be 33
- abrogated and of no further force and effect. 34
