A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

State Board of Barbers and State Board of Cosmetologists – Special Fund and Fees

4 FOR the purpose of establishing the State Barbers and Cosmetologists Boards' Fund as a $\mathbf{5}$ special, nonlapsing fund in the Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation; 6 specifying the contents of the Fund; requiring that the Fund be used for certain 7 purposes; requiring the Secretary of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation, or a designee 8 of the Secretary, to administer the Fund; providing for an audit of the Fund; 9 requiring any unspent and unencumbered portion of the Fund in excess of a certain 10 amount to revert to the General Fund at the end of each fiscal year; crediting certain 11 earnings to the General Fund; requiring the Secretary, in consultation with the State 12Board of Barbers and the State Board of Cosmetologists, to annually calculate 13 certain costs; authorizing the State Board of Barbers and the State Board of 14 Cosmetologists to set by regulation certain fees based on certain calculations; 15requiring each board to publish a certain fee schedule; repealing provisions of law requiring each board to pay certain money into the General Fund of the State; 1617requiring each board to pay certain fees to the Comptroller; requiring the 18 Comptroller to distribute certain fees to the Fund; prohibiting certain fees from 19increasing by more than a certain amount each year; altering certain fees; requiring 20that certain fees in effect on a certain date shall remain in full force and effect until 21certain other fees are adopted and become effective; and generally relating to the 22State Barbers and Cosmetologists Boards' Fund.
