FOR the purpose of requiring the State Highway Administration to keep and maintain
certain records about highway cleanup on State highways; requiring the
Administration to report annually certain records on highway cleanup under certain
State-county agreements to the General Assembly by a certain date; requiring the
Administration to publish annually on its website certain highway cleanup schedules
and certain related information by a certain date; and generally relating to record
keeping and reporting on highway cleanup by the State Highway Administration.

- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

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1 (V) 1. A. A DESCRIPTION OF THE PROCESSES AND 2 DUTIES OF THE ADMINISTRATION'S OFFICE OF MAINTENANCE, DIVISION OF 3 HIGHWAY MAINTENANCE – MAINTENANCE OPERATIONS; AND

4 B. A SUMMARY OF THE OFFICE'S OVERSIGHT OF LITTER 5 CONTROL PROGRAMS; AND

6 2. A SUMMARY OF HOW THE OFFICE'S CURRENT 7 PERFORMANCE MEASUREMENT, RESOURCE ANALYSIS, AND SURVEY RESOURCES 8 MAY BE USED TO:

12 C. ENSURE THAT EACH COUNTY IS RECEIVING AN 13 EQUITABLE LEVEL OF HIGHWAY CLEANUP RESOURCES; AND

14(VI) ALL INFORMATION AVAILABLE ON POSTCLEANUP15PROCESSES, INCLUDING HOW THE ADMINISTRATION DETERMINES WHETHER A16CLEANUP PROJECT IS COMPLETE.

17 (B) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 31, 2023, AND EACH DECEMBER 31 18 THEREAFTER, THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL PUBLISH ON ITS WEBSITE BY COUNTY:

19(1)A FULL LIST OF EXISTING AND SCHEDULED HIGHWAY CLEANUP20PROJECTS; AND

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(2) ALL HIGHWAY CLEANUP SCHEDULES AND NOTICES.

(C) ON OR BEFORE FEBRUARY 1, 2024, AND EACH FEBRUARY 1 THEREAFTER, THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1257 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, REPORT TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY THE RECORDS REQUIRED TO BE KEPT UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION FOR THE PREVIOUS CALENDAR YEAR.

27 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 28 October 1, 2023.
