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## State Personnel - Rights and Protections for Nursing Mothers

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the State, through its appropriate officers and employees, to 4 provide a reasonable break time for an employee to express breast milk for her 5 nursing child for a certain period of time after the child's birth each time the employee needs to express the milk and, on notice, to provide a certain place that 6 7 may be used by an employee to express breast milk; prohibiting the State from being 8 required to compensate an employee receiving reasonable break time for any time spent expressing breast milk at work; and generally relating to rights and 9 10 protections for nursing mothers employed by the State.

- 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 17 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 18 Article State Personnel and Pensions
- 19 **2–310.**
- 20 (A) THE STATE, THROUGH ITS APPROPRIATE OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES,
- 21 SHALL PROVIDE:

- 1 (1) A REASONABLE BREAK TIME FOR AN EMPLOYEE TO EXPRESS 2 BREAST MILK FOR HER NURSING CHILD FOR 1 YEAR AFTER THE CHILD'S BIRTH EACH 3 TIME THE EMPLOYEE NEEDS TO EXPRESS THE MILK; AND
- 4 (2) ON NOTICE, A PLACE, OTHER THAN A BATHROOM, THAT IS SHIELDED FROM VIEW AND FREE FROM COWORKERS AND THE PUBLIC AND THAT 6 MAY BE USED BY AN EMPLOYEE TO EXPRESS BREAST MILK.
- 7 (B) THE STATE MAY NOT BE REQUIRED TO COMPENSATE AN EMPLOYEE 8 RECEIVING REASONABLE BREAK TIME UNDER SUBSECTION (A)(1) OF THIS SECTION 9 FOR ANY TIME SPENT EXPRESSING BREAST MILK AT WORK.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2018.
