# A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

# 2 Election Law – Circuit Court Judges – Nonpartisan General Elections

- FOR the purpose of requiring circuit court judges to be elected on a nonpartisan basis in a
   general election; prohibiting a candidate for circuit court judge from appearing on
   the ballot in a primary election or being nominated by a political party or by petition;
   and generally relating to nonpartisan general elections for circuit court judges.

6 (a) This section does not apply to:

7 (1) a candidate selected by a political party to fill a vacancy in nomination

10 (b) (1) [Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, the] **THE** name of 11 a candidate who is defeated for the nomination for a public office may not appear on the 12 ballot at the next succeeding general election as a candidate for any office.

13 (2) A candidate who is defeated for the nomination for a public office may 14 not file a certificate of candidacy as a write—in candidate at the next succeeding general 15 election as a candidate for any office.

16 [(c) The name of a candidate for the office of judge of the circuit court who is 17 defeated in the primary election in each contest for the office of circuit court judge in which 18 the candidate appears on the ballot may not appear on the ballot at the succeeding general 19 election as a candidate for any office.]

2 (B) (1) THE CANDIDATES, EQUAL IN NUMBER TO THE NUMBER OF 3 OFFICES TO BE FILLED, WHO RECEIVE THE LARGEST NUMBER OF VOTES IN THE 4 GENERAL ELECTION SHALL BE DECLARED ELECTED.

5 (2) IF TWO OR MORE CANDIDATES EACH RECEIVE THE LOWEST 6 NUMBER OF VOTES NECESSARY TO QUALIFY FOR ELECTION, CREATING A TIE FOR 7 THE LAST OFFICE TO BE FILLED, THE OFFICE SHALL BE CONSIDERED VACANT AND 8 SHALL BE FILLED AS IF THE VACANCY OCCURRED DURING THE TERM OF OFFICE.

- 14 (ii)] appellate judges, continuance in office, in the following order:
- 15 [1.] (I) Court of Appeals; and
- 16 [2.] (II) Court of Special Appeals;
- 17 (9) offices filled by nonpartisan election.

18 (g) (1) Except for contests for [judicial office or] an office to be filled by 19 nonpartisan election, the party affiliation of a candidate who is a nominee of a political 20 party shall be indicated on the ballot.

21 (2) (i) A candidate who is not a nominee of a political party or affiliated 22 with a partian organization shall be designated as an "unaffiliated".

(ii) A candidate who is affiliated with a partisan organization shall
be designated under "other candidates".

(3) The names of candidates for judge of the circuit court or for a county
board of education, and the names of incumbent appellate judges, shall be placed on the
ballot without a party label or other distinguishing mark or location which might indicate
party affiliation.
