1 AN ACT concerning

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Environment - At-Store Recycling - Plastic Carryout Bags

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the operator of certain retail stores to establish an 4 at-store recycling program for plastic carryout bags; requiring certain retail 5 stores to print or display certain language on plastic carryout bags provided by 6 the store; requiring certain stores to provide certain collection bins for the 7 recycling of plastic carryout bags in a certain manner; requiring certain stores 8 to make reusable bags available to customers; requiring a plastic carryout bag 9 manufacturer to develop and make available certain educational materials; 10 providing that a county or municipality is not prohibited from adopting certain 11 ordinances, resolutions, regulations, or rules under certain circumstances; 12 establishing certain penalties for certain violations; providing for the recovery of 13 the penalties in certain civil actions; requiring certain civil penalties to be 14 deposited into a certain Fund; requiring the Department of the Environment to 15 adopt certain regulations; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the 16 recycling of plastic carryout bags.
