2 **Harford County – Alcoholic Beverages – Hours of Sale for Class B Licensees**

3 FOR the purpose of altering the hours of sale for a Class B Cafe licensee in Harford
4 County; and generally relating to the sale of alcoholic beverages in Harford
5 County.

6 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
7 Article 2B – Alcoholic Beverages
8 Section 11–513
9 Annotated Code of Maryland
10 (2011 Replacement Volume and 2012 Supplement)

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

13 **Article 2B – Alcoholic Beverages**

14 11–513.

15 (a) The provisions of this section apply in Harford County only.

16 (b) (1) A licensee may sell, offer for sale, or dispense alcoholic beverages:

17 (i) On Monday through Sunday; and

2 (2) [A Class B Cafe licensee may offer to sell beer and wine:

3 (i) On Monday through Saturday from 10 a.m. to 11 p.m.; and

4 (ii) On Sunday from 10 a.m. to 11 p.m.

5 (3)] During a baseball game only, a licensee who holds a stadium
6 on-sale license under § 8-213.1 of this article may not sell alcoholic beverages:

7 (i) After the beginning of the eighth inning; or

8 (ii) During a doubleheader game, after the beginning of the
9 sixth inning of the second game.

10 (c) A licensee may not:

11 (1) Allow alcoholic beverages to be consumed on the licensee's
12 premises after 2:15 a.m. or before 8:00 a.m. the same morning; or

13 (2) Allow alcoholic beverages glasses, bottles, or containers to remain
14 on tables or serving counters after 2:30 a.m.

15 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
16 July 1, 2013.
