A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Public Health – Dental Services for Adults – Coverage and Access**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring, beginning on a certain date, the Maryland Medical
4 Assistance Program to provide dental services to postpartum women during a certain
5 period; requiring that certain dental services for postpartum women be included as
6 a benefit under a certain program under the Program; requiring the Department of
7 Health and Mental Hygiene, in conjunction with certain entities, to work with
8 stakeholders to identify certain options for expanding access to dental services;
9 requiring the Department to report its findings to certain committees of the General
10 Assembly on or before a certain date; and generally relating to coverage of and access
11 to dental services for adults.

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
2 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 **Article – Health – General**

4 15–103.

5 (a) (1) The Secretary shall administer the Maryland Medical Assistance
6 Program.

7 (2) The Program:

8 (ii) Shall provide, subject to the limitations of the State budget,
9 comprehensive medical and other health care services for all eligible pregnant women
10 whose family income is at or below 250 percent of the poverty level, as permitted by the
11 federal law;

12 (xi) May include bedside nursing care for eligible Program recipients;

13 [and]

14 (xii) Shall provide services in accordance with funding restrictions
15 included in the annual State budget bill; AND

16 **(XIII) BEGINNING JULY 1, 2016, SHALL PROVIDE, SUBJECT**
17 **TO THE LIMITATIONS OF THE STATE BUDGET, A DENTAL SERVICE TO A POSTPARTUM**
18 **WOMAN DURING THE PERIOD THE POSTPARTUM WOMAN IS ELIGIBLE FOR MEDICAL**
19 **BENEFITS.**

20 (b) (1) As permitted by federal law or waiver, the Secretary may establish a
21 program under which Program recipients are required to enroll in managed care
22 organizations.

23 (2) (i) The benefits required by the program developed under
24 paragraph (1) of this subsection shall be adopted by regulation and shall be equivalent to
25 the benefit level required by the Maryland Medical Assistance Program on January 1, 1996.

26 (v) Notwithstanding subparagraph (i) of this paragraph, the benefits
27 required by the program developed under paragraph (1) of this subsection shall include
28 [dental]:

29 1. **DENTAL** services for pregnant women; AND

30 2. **DENTAL SERVICES FOR POSTPARTUM WOMEN THAT**
31 **THE PROGRAM IS REQUIRED TO PROVIDE UNDER SUBSECTION (A)(2)(XIII) OF THIS**
32 **SECTION.**

1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Department of Health
2 and Mental Hygiene shall:

3 (1) in conjunction with the Maryland Health Benefit Exchange and the
4 Maryland Insurance Administration, work with stakeholders to identify short-term and
5 long-term options for expanding access to dental services for adults, including older adults;
6 and

7 (2) on or before December 31, 2015, report its findings to the Senate
8 Finance Committee and House Health and Government Operations Committee, in
9 accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article.

10 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
11 October 1, 2015.
