Higher Education – Nonresident Tuition – Exemption for Spouses and Dependents of Honorably Discharged Veterans

4 FOR the purpose of exempting a spouse or financially dependent child of an honorably 5 discharged veteran of the United States armed forces from paying nonresident 6 tuition at certain institutions of higher education in the State under certain 7 circumstances; clarifying that the exemption for certain honorably discharged 8 veterans of the United States armed forces from paying nonresident tuition at certain institutions applies to a veteran honorably discharged at any time; specifying 9 10 that a certain spouse or financially dependent child who is exempt from paying 11 nonresident tuition at certain institutions will continue to be exempt under certain 12 circumstances; repealing a requirement that certain public institutions of higher 13 education comply with certain federal law; defining a certain term; making conforming changes; and generally relating to nonresident tuition exemptions for 14 15 spouses and financially dependent children of honorably discharged veterans at 16 public institutions of higher education.


