
Education - Public Schools - Required Number of School Days or Hours

- 3 FOR the purpose of altering the requirement that certain public schools be open for at least 4 a certain number of days and a minimum number of hours during a certain period 5 of time to require that the schools be open for at least a certain number of days or a 6 minimum number of hours during a certain period of time; providing that certain 7 funding for schools may not be reduced if there are fewer than a certain number of 8 school hours under certain circumstances; making conforming changes; making a 9 stylistic change; and generally relating to the required number of school days or 10 school hours for elementary and secondary public schools.

6 7 8 9 10	(e) (1) The county boards of Allegany, Anne Arundel, Calvert, Howard Montgomery, and Prince George's counties, and the Board of School Commissioners of Baltimore City, may elect to operate one or more schools within the county or Baltimore City on a year—round basis, provided that the 180—day [and] OR the minimum hour requirements under this section are met.			
11 12	(2) Nothing in this section precludes a county board from conducting a year—round pilot study or program that is funded by the county board.			
13 14	(f) Publicly funded prekindergarten programs are not subject to the requirements of subsection (a) of this section.
