A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Alcoholic Beverages – Class 1 Distillery Licenses

- 3 FOR the purpose of altering the activities allowed to be conducted at a plant established 4 and operated by a holder of a Class 1 distillery license; allowing the license holder to acquire alcoholic beverages from a holder of any manufacturer's license or $\mathbf{5}$ 6 wholesaler's license or a holder of a nonresident dealer's permit for use in 7 manufacturing; repealing a provision of law requiring that the license holder acquire 8 certain alcoholic beverages in bulk; authorizing the license holder to serve at no cost 9 or for a fee certain product samples to certain participants in a guided tour of the 10 licensed premises; altering the amount and contents of product samples that may be 11 served; altering the amount of products that the license holder may sell to certain 12participants in a guided tour of the licensed premises; altering certain time restrictions on certain activities of license holders who sell products to certain 13participants in a guided tour; and generally relating to Class 1 distillery licenses. 14
