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## Public Schools - Student Sunscreen Use - Policy

3 FOR the purpose of requiring each county board of education to adopt a certain written 4 policy to authorize a student to possess and use sunscreen on school property or at a 5 school-sponsored activity without written permission from a health care provider; 6 requiring a certain policy to allow certain public school employees to apply or assist a student in applying sunscreen under certain circumstances; providing that a 7 8 student may only use sunscreen provided by the student's parent or guardian; providing that public schools and public school employees that assist a student in 9 the application of sunscreen according to a certain policy cannot be held liable for 10 certain outcomes; requiring each county board to encourage public schools to educate 11 students about certain policies and sun safety measures; defining a certain term; and 12 generally relating to a policy for public school student sunscreen use. 13

28 (E) (C) EACH COUNTY BOARD SHALL ENCOURAGE PUBLIC SCHOOLS TO 29 EDUCATE STUDENTS ABOUT SUNSCREEN, SUN SAFETY, AND THE POLICY 30 ESTABLISHED UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION.
