BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Election Law Section 16–401 Annotated Code of Maryland (2010 Replacement Volume and 2014 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND. That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Election Law 16-401. A person may not willfully and knowingly: (a) give, transfer, promise, or offer anything of value for the purpose of inducing another person to sign or not sign any petition;
