- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Medical Assistance Program, subject to a 5 certain limitation, to provide health care services appropriately delivered through 6 telehealth, including services that are provided using an audio-only call; altering a 7 certain provision of law requiring the Program to provide certain mental health 8 services to require the services to include the use of an audio-only call; providing 9 that certain regulations may not prohibit a health care provider from using 10 audio-only calls to provide certain services; altering a certain definition; and generally relating to telehealth. 11

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 7 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 8 Article - Health - General 9 15-103.10 The Secretary shall administer the Maryland Medical Assistance (a) (1) 11 Program. 12 **(2)** The Program: 13 Shall provide, subject to the limitations of the State budget. mental health services appropriately delivered through telehealth to a patient in the 14 patient's home setting, INCLUDING THROUGH THE USE OF AN AUDIO-ONLY CALL: [and] 15 16 (xvi) Beginning on January 1, 2021, shall provide, subject to the 17 limitations of the State budget and § 15–855(b)(2) of the Insurance Article, and as permitted 18 by federal law, services for pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated 19 with streptococcal infections and pediatric acute onset neuropsychiatric syndrome, 20 including the use of intravenous immunoglobulin therapy, for eligible Program recipients, 21if pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated with streptococcal infections 22and pediatric acute onset neuropsychiatric syndrome are coded for billing and diagnosis purposes in accordance with § 15–855(d) of the Insurance Article; AND 23 24(XVII) SHALL PROVIDE, SUBJECT TO THE LIMITATIONS OF THE 25STATE BUDGET, HEALTH CARE SERVICES APPROPRIATELY DELIVERED THROUGH TELEHEALTH, INCLUDING SERVICES THAT ARE PROVIDED USING AN AUDIO-ONLY 26 27 CALL. **Article - Health Occupations** 28 29 1-1001.30 In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated. (a) "Asynchronous telehealth interaction" means an exchange of information 31
- between a patient and a health care practitioner that does not occur in real time, including the secure collection and transmission of a patient's medical information, clinical data, clinical images, laboratory results, and self—reported medical history.

- 1 (c) "Health care practitioner" means an individual who is licensed, certified, or otherwise authorized by law to provide health care services under this article.
- 3 (d) "Synchronous telehealth interaction" means an exchange of information 4 between a patient and a health care practitioner that occurs in real time.
- 5 (e) (1) "Telehealth" means a mode of delivering health care services, 6 INCLUDING SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER AND MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES, through the 7 use of telecommunications technologies by a health care practitioner to a patient at a 8 different physical location than the health care practitioner.
- 9 (2) "Telehealth" includes synchronous and asynchronous interactions **AND** 10 **AUDIO-ONLY CALLS**.
- 11 (3) "Telehealth" does not include the provision of health care services solely through [audio-only calls,] e-mail messages [,] or facsimile transmissions.

- 14 (a) A health occupations board may adopt regulations to implement this subtitle.
- 15 (b) Regulations adopted by a health occupations board under subsection (a) of this 16 section:
- 17 (1) May not establish a separate standard of care for telehealth; [and]
- 18 (2) Shall allow for the establishment of a practitioner–patient relationship 19 through a synchronous telehealth interaction or an asynchronous telehealth interaction 20 provided by a health care practitioner who is complying with the health care practitioner's 21 standard of care; AND
- 22 (3) MAY NOT PROHIBIT A HEALTH CARE PROVIDER FROM USING 23 AUDIO-ONLY CALLS TO PROVIDE HEALTH CARE SERVICES THROUGH TELEHEALTH.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2021.
