A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Somerset County – Emergency Burning Ban – Adoption and Enforcement

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the County Commissioners of Somerset County to 4 adopt a certain emergency burning ban; prohibiting a person from starting or $\mathbf{5}$ allowing any open air burning during an emergency burning ban; exempting 6 certain supervised burning activities from a certain emergency burning ban; 7 authorizing the County Commissioners, by resolution, to set a fine for a 8 violation of a certain emergency burning ban; authorizing the Sheriff of 9 Somerset County and the Sheriff's deputies to assess a certain fine against any person believed to be in violation of a certain emergency burning ban; defining 10 certain terms; and generally relating to the adoption and enforcement of an 11 12emergency burning ban in Somerset County.

Article 20 – Somerset County

22 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE 23 MEANINGS INDICATED.

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW. [Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.



1 (2) "EMERGENCY BURNING BAN" MEANS A COMPLETE BAN ON 2 ALL OPEN AIR BURNING THAT IS DECLARED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS 3 DUE TO PROLONGED DROUGHT OR UNUSUAL CONDITIONS THAT ARE 4 CONDUCIVE TO THE EASY START AND SPREAD OF FIRE.

5 (3) "OPEN AIR BURNING" MEANS BURNING ANY MATERIAL IN THE
6 OPEN OR IN A RECEPTACLE OTHER THAN A FURNACE, INCINERATOR, OR OTHER
7 EQUIPMENT CONNECTED TO A STACK OR CHIMNEY.

8 (B) THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MAY ADOPT AN EMERGENCY 9 BURNING BAN EFFECTIVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTY.

10 (C) (1) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, A PERSON 11 MAY NOT START OR ALLOW OPEN AIR BURNING DURING AN EMERGENCY 12 BURNING BAN.

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(2) THIS SUBSECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO:

(I) THE SUPERVISED BURNING OF BUILDINGS OR SOLID,
LIQUID, OR GASEOUS FUELS CONDUCTED UNDER THE DIRECT CONTROL AND
SUPERVISION OF QUALIFIED INSTRUCTORS AT A TRAINING CENTER OPERATED
BY A FIRE DEPARTMENT; OR

18 (II) ANY OTHER SUPERVISED BURNING CONDUCTED UNDER
 19 THE DIRECT CONTROL AND SUPERVISION OF:

1. A QUALIFIED FIRE INSTRUCTOR; OR

21 **2.** A FIRE CHIEF, CAPTAIN, OR FIRE LINE OFFICER 22 OF A FIRE DEPARTMENT THAT HAS JURISDICTION OVER THE AREA WHERE THE 23 SUPERVISED BURNING OCCURS.

(D) THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, BY RESOLUTION, MAY SET A FINE
FOR A VIOLATION OF AN EMERGENCY BURNING BAN ADOPTED UNDER
SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION.

(E) THE SHERIFF AND THE SHERIFF'S DEPUTIES MAY ASSESS A FINE
ESTABLISHED UNDER SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS SECTION AGAINST ANY PERSON
BELIEVED TO BE IN VIOLATION OF AN EMERGENCY BURNING BAN ADOPTED
UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION.
