21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
22 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

2 18–1702.3 (a) There is a scholarship program known as the Walter Sondheim Jr. Public
4 Service Summer Internship Scholarship Program in the State.5 (b) The purpose of the Program is to assist college and graduate students to
6 explore public service career opportunities through summer internships.7 (c) The Shriver Center shall administer the Program.8 (d) On or before January 1 of each year, an institution of higher education in
9 the State may nominate eligible students to participate in the Program.10 (e) Priority for participation in the Program shall be given to an eligible
11 student who:12 (1) Is a resident of the State;13 (2) Has demonstrated an interest in a career in public service; and14 (3) Assists in providing:15 (i) Legal services:16 1. [to] TO low-income residents in the State who cannot
17 afford legal services; OR18 2. IN A PUBLIC SERVICE POSITION;19 (ii) Social work services to low-income residents in the State;20 (iii) Nursing services in nursing shortage areas in the State as
21 defined in § 18–802 of this title; or22 (iv) Other services in the public or nonprofit sectors in which
23 there is a shortage of qualified practitioners to low-income or underserved residents or
24 areas of the State.25 (f) (1) Subject to paragraph (3) of this subsection, on or before May 1 of
26 each year, the Shriver Center shall award scholarships to eligible students who have
27 agreed to serve in a public service summer internship.28 (2) The Shriver Center shall award no more than:29 (i) 75 scholarships for the summer of 2008; and

1 (ii) 100 scholarships for the summer of 2009.

2 (3) Funds for the scholarships awarded under this subtitle shall be as
3 provided in the State budget.

4 (g) Subject to the availability of funds, the scholarship award under the
5 Program shall be \$3,000.

6 (h) The Shriver Center shall serve as a clearinghouse for public and
7 nonprofit entities who wish to hire public service summer interns participating in the
8 Program.

4 ~~(b) The Office of Student Financial Assistance shall assist in the repayment~~
5 ~~of the amount of any higher education loan owed by an individual who:~~

6 ~~(1) (i) Receives a graduate, professional, or undergraduate degree~~

8 ~~1. A college or university in the State [of Maryland]; or~~
