1 AN ACT concerning

2 Crimes – Unattended Restraint of Dogs in Extreme Temperatures

 certain penalties apply to a violation of this Act; and generally relating to the
 unattended restraint of dogs.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 16 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 17 (2) "Collar" means a device constructed of nylon, leather, or similar 18 material specifically designed to be used around the neck of a dog.
- 19 (3) "Restraint" means a chain, rope, tether, leash, cable, or other device 20 that attaches a dog to a stationary object or trolley system.
- 21 (b) A person may not leave a dog outside and unattended by use of a restraint:
