12 13	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17		(1) An active duty member of the United States armed forces;

5 6 7 8	(b) Notwithstanding any other provision of this article, an individual described in subsection (a) of this section who attends a public institution of higher education in the State is exempt from paying nonresident tuition at a public institution of higher education in this State if:

11	(i) Is stationed in this State;		
12	(ii) Resides in this State; or		
13	(iii) Is domiciled in this State;		
14 15	(2) The honorably discharged veteran presents the following documentation within [1 year] 4 YEARS after the veteran's discharge:

27 28 29 30 31	(c) Notwithstanding any other provision of this article, a spouse or financially dependent child of an active duty member who enrolls as an entering student in a public institution of higher education and is exempt from paying nonresident tuition under subsection (b) of this section shall continue to be exempt from paying nonresident tuition if:		

- 1 (1) The active duty member no longer meets the requirements of subsection (b)(1) of this section; and
- 3 (2) The spouse or financially dependent child remains continuously 4 enrolled at the public institution of higher education.
- 5 (d) The Commission shall adopt regulations in accordance with Title 10, 6 Subtitle 1 of the State Government Article to implement the provisions of this section.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 8 July 1, 2012.
