- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring, rather than authorizing, the Motor Vehicle 5 Administration to make a certain notation on a driver's license or identification 6 card of an applicant who selects designation as an organ donor; requiring the 7 Administration to notify applicants who select designation as a donor that the 8 designation will remain effective until the applicant requests that the 9 designation be removed and that the designation may be removed by the applicant through specified means; altering the manner in which a donor 10 designation may be removed from a driver's license or identification card; 11 12requiring the Administration to note an applicant's designation as a donor on 13 certain subsequently issued documents under certain circumstances; making certain stylistic and conforming changes; and generally relating to the 14 designation of organ donor status on drivers' licenses and identification cards. 15

- 21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 22 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Transportation

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25 (a) The Administration shall provide for a method by which an applicant for 26 a driver's license or identification card can designate that the applicant consents to the



- gift of all body organs or parts for the purposes of transplantation, therapy, or medical research and education.
- 3 (b) If an applicant [designates that he is such donor] SELECTS
 4 DESIGNATION AS A DONOR UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION, the
 5 Administration [may] SHALL make a notation of this fact on the driver's license or
- 6 identification card issued to the applicant.
- 7 (c) THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL NOTIFY AN APPLICANT WHO SELECTS 8 DESIGNATION AS A DONOR THAT THE DESIGNATION:
- 9 (1) WILL REMAIN EFFECTIVE UNTIL THE APPLICANT REQUESTS 10 THAT THE DESIGNATION BE REMOVED; AND
- 11 (2) MAY BE REMOVED BY THE APPLICANT:
- 12 (I) BY REQUESTING A REPLACEMENT DRIVER'S LICENSE 13 OR IDENTIFICATION CARD:
- 14 THROUGH THE ADMINISTRATION'S WEB SITE; OR
- 15 **2.** IN PERSON AT ANY FULL-SERVICE 16 **ADMINISTRATION OFFICE;** OR
- 17 (II) THROUGH THE STATE DONOR REGISTRY ESTABLISHED 18 UNDER § 4–516 OF THE ESTATES AND TRUSTS ARTICLE.
- 19 (D) UNLESS REMOVED AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C)(2) OF THIS 20 SECTION, THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL NOTE AN APPLICANT'S DESIGNATION AS 21 A DONOR ON ALL SUBSEQUENTLY ISSUED DRIVERS' LICENSES OR 22 IDENTIFICATION CARDS.
- 23 **(E)** The donor designation noted on the driver's license or identification card:
- 24 (1) Is sufficient legal authority for the removal of a body organ or part 25 on the death of the donor; and
- 26 (2) [May be removed only on written notice to the Administration by 27 the donor.
- 28 (d)] Notwithstanding any other provision of law, [the donor designation noted on the driver's license or identification card] is valid and effective for all purposes under Title 4, Subtitle 5 of the Estates and Trusts Article, including the immunity from civil or criminal liability set forth in § 4–514 of the Estates and Trusts Article.

- [(e) At the time the donor authorizes the donor designation to appear on his driver's license or identification card, the Administration shall notify the donor that the designation can be removed only on written notice to the Administration.]
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 5 October 1, 2014.
