- **(II) COMPOSTING;** 6
- 7 (III) LAWN WATERING;
- (IV) **IRRIGATION; AND** 8
- 9 **(**V**)** FLUSHING OF A CONVENTIONAL TOILET OR URINAL.
- (2) 10 A PERSON MAY USE REUSABLE DIVERTED WATER ONLY:

11 **(I)** ON THE SITE ON WHICH THE REUSABLE DIVERTED WATER 12**ORIGINATES; AND**

13IN ACCORDANCE WITH ANY APPLICABLE STATE AND LOCAL **(II)** LAWS OR REGULATIONS, INCLUDING STATE AND LOCAL PLUMBING CODES. 14

15SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 16 October 1, 2019.
