A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Minority Business Enterprises – Study and Report

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs and the Office 4 of Minority Business Enterprise in the Maryland Department of Transportation $\mathbf{5}$ to conduct a certain study with certain parties on how the State can assist 6 certain minority business enterprises in transitioning from subcontractors to 7 prime contractors; requiring the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs and the 8 Office of Minority Business Enterprise to report to certain committees of the 9 General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to a study of and report on transitioning 10 minority business enterprises from subcontractors to prime contractors. 11

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 13 MARYLAND, That:

14 (a) The Governor's Office of Minority Affairs and the Office of Minority 15 Business Enterprise in the Maryland Department of Transportation shall conduct a 16 study with all interested parties on how the State can assist minority business 17 enterprises in transitioning from subcontractors to prime contractors on State 18 procurements, including:

- 19 (1) construction procurements and all other types of procurements 20 that utilize minority business enterprises; and
- (2) a process for giving credit to former subcontractors that submit
 bids as prime contractors for satisfactory work performed as subcontractors for other
 prime contractors under previous State procurements.
- (b) On or before October 1, 2015, the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs
 and the Office of Minority Business Enterprise shall submit a report to the Senate
 Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs Committee and the House Health and

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1 Government Operations Committee, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State 2 Government Article, that includes recommendations on how the State can assist 3 minority business enterprises in transitioning from subcontractors to prime 4 contractors and any regulations or legislation identified by the study.

5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 6 October 1, 2014. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of 7 September 30, 2016, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act 8 shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

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
