1 AN ACT concerning

Human Services - Trauma-Informed Care - Commission and Training (Healing Maryland's Trauma Act)

FOR the purpose of establishing the Commission on Trauma–Informed Care; providing for 4 $\mathbf{5}$ the composition, chair, and staffing of the Commission; providing that the 6 Commission is an independent commission functioning in the Department of Human $\overline{7}$ Services; providing for the purpose of the Commission; requiring the Commission to 8 determine certain procedures; providing for the terms of members of the 9 Commission; requiring the Governor to designate the chair of the Commission; 10 prohibiting a member of the Commission from receiving certain compensation, but 11 authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; providing that a majority of 12members serving on the Commission is a quorum; requiring the Commission to 13 identify certain programs and services; requiring the Commission to assist in the 14development of a certain statewide trauma-responsive strategy; requiring the 15Commission to establish certain metrics, in collaboration with the Maryland 16 Department of Health, related to a certain initiative; requiring the Commission to 17coordinate and develop, in consultation with the Maryland Department of Health, 18 certain training on trauma-informed care; requiring the Commission to disseminate 19 certain information among agencies; requiring the Commission to advise and assist 20the Governor for a certain purpose; requiring the Commission to report its findings 21and recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a 22certain date each year; requiring the Commission, in consultation with the Maryland Department of Health, the Department of Human Services, and the Maryland 2324Health Care Commission, to conduct a certain study of a certain program and 25implement a certain program; providing for the purpose of a certain program;
