4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a public school from prohibiting a student from organizing

- or participating in a student-organized peaceful demonstration, imposing certain 5 6 limits on a student's right to free speech while participating in a student-organized 7 peaceful demonstration, or disciplining a student for organizing or participating in a 8 student-organized peaceful demonstration under certain circumstances; requiring each county board of education to develop a written policy regarding 9 10 student-organized peaceful demonstrations; and generally relating 11 student-organized peaceful demonstrations and student discipline.

- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 18 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 19 Article Education
- 20 **7–311.**
- 21 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION, "STUDENT-ORGANIZED PEACEFUL
- 22 DEMONSTRATION" MEANS A NONVIOLENT DEMONSTRATION INTENDED TO EXPRESS
- 23 THE VIEWPOINT OF A STUDENT.



- 1 (2) "STUDENT-ORGANIZED PEACEFUL DEMONSTRATION" DOES NOT
 2 INCLUDE A DEMONSTRATION THAT INCITES A STUDENT TO:
 3 (I) CREATE A CLEAR AND PRESENT DANGER TO THE HEALTH,
 4 SAFETY, OR WELFARE OF THE SCHOOL COMMUNITY; OR
- 5 (II) COMMIT AN UNLAWFUL OR DANGEROUS ACT.
- 6 (B) THIS SECTION APPLIES TO A STUDENT-ORGANIZED PEACEFUL 7 DEMONSTRATION THAT OCCURS:
- 8 (1) ON SCHOOL PROPERTY;
- 9 (2) AT A SCHOOL-SPONSORED ACTIVITY OR EVENT; OR
- 10 (3) ON A SCHOOL BUS.
- 11 (C) (1) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, A PUBLIC SCHOOL MAY NOT:
- 13 (I) PROHIBIT A STUDENT FROM ORGANIZING OR 14 PARTICIPATING IN A STUDENT-ORGANIZED PEACEFUL DEMONSTRATION; OR
- 15 (II) IMPOSE LIMITS THAT SUBSTANTIALLY INHIBIT A STUDENT'S 16 RIGHT TO FREE SPEECH WHILE PARTICIPATING IN A STUDENT-ORGANIZED
- 17 PEACEFUL DEMONSTRATION.
- 18 (2) A SCHOOL MAY IMPOSE REASONABLE LIMITATIONS ON THE TIME 19 AND PLACE OF A STUDENT-ORGANIZED PEACEFUL DEMONSTRATION IN ORDER TO:
- 20 (I) PROTECT THE HEALTH, SAFETY, AND WELFARE OF 21 STUDENTS AND SCHOOL PERSONNEL; AND
- 22 (II) MINIMIZE DISRUPTION TO THE EDUCATIONAL 23 ENVIRONMENT.
- 24 (D) A PUBLIC SCHOOL MAY NOT DISCIPLINE A STUDENT FOR ORGANIZING 25 OR PARTICIPATING IN A STUDENT-ORGANIZED PEACEFUL DEMONSTRATION IF:
- 26 (1) THE SCHOOL ADMINISTRATION IS NOTIFIED OF A STUDENT'S 27 INTENT TO ENGAGE IN A STUDENT-ORGANIZED PEACEFUL DEMONSTRATION AT
- 28 LEAST 48 HOURS IN ADVANCE OF THE DEMONSTRATION; AND

- 1 (2) THE STUDENT COMPLIES WITH THE WRITTEN POLICY 2 ESTABLISHED UNDER SUBSECTION (F) OF THIS SECTION.
- 3 (E) IF A STUDENT DOES NOT COMPLY WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF 4 SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS SECTION, A SCHOOL MAY NOT IMPOSE A DISCIPLINARY
- 5 ACTION ON THE STUDENT THAT IS GREATER THAN THE CONSEQUENCE FOR AN
- 6 UNLAWFULLY ABSENT STUDENT.
- 7 (F) (1) EACH COUNTY BOARD SHALL DEVELOP A WRITTEN POLICY 8 REGARDING STUDENT-ORGANIZED PEACEFUL DEMONSTRATIONS.
- 9 **(2)** THE POLICY DEVELOPED UNDER PARAGRAPH **(1)** OF THIS 10 SUBSECTION:
- 11 (I) SHALL INCLUDE GUIDELINES FOR:
- 1. The time and place of a student-organized
- 13 PEACEFUL DEMONSTRATION; AND
- 14 2. THE MANNER OF EXPRESSION BY A STUDENT
- 15 PARTICIPATING IN A STUDENT-ORGANIZED PEACEFUL DEMONSTRATION;
- 16 (II) SHALL DEFINE WHAT CONSTITUTES:
- 17 1. REASONABLE REQUIREMENTS LIMITING THE TIME
- 18 AND PLACE OF A STUDENT-ORGANIZED PEACEFUL DEMONSTRATION; AND
- 19 2. REASONABLE GUIDELINES FOR THE TIME, PLACE,
- 20 AND MANNER OF EXPRESSION BY A STUDENT ENGAGING IN A STUDENT-ORGANIZED
- 21 PEACEFUL DEMONSTRATION; AND
- 22 (III) NOTWITHSTANDING THE PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTION (C)
- 23 OF THIS SECTION, MAY INCLUDE LIMITATIONS ON LANGUAGE THAT HAS THE INTENT
- 24 TO HARASS, THREATEN, OR INTIMIDATE OTHER PEOPLE.
- 25 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
- 26 1, 2023.
